COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

This collection consists of a scrapbook of clippings, possibly kept by William M. Porter, editor of the *Carlisle Herald*. William M. Porter began editorship of the *Carlisle Herald* in 1857, succeeding Capt. E. Beatty. He served as editor until January 11, 1860, when Albert K. Rheem purchased the paper.

The scrapbook contains clippings primarily from the *Carlisle Herald*, but also some from the *Mechanicsburg Weekly Gazette*. Topics covered include Dickinson College, Irving Female College, popular literature, and local events.

Pages in the scrapbook have pencilled numbering on them. There is a gap between numbers 39 and 50, pages 40 through 49 apparently having been overlooked. Loose clippings throughout the scrapbook have been placed in separate folders indicating the double page from which they were removed.

Two clippings have been separated out due to their size and are stored in an oversized folder, OC 1998.6.
