If the Resolution of Congress be not what my Fellow citizens of Pennsylvania desire, it is not for want of the warmest Affection & the strongest exertion on my part to contribute to the Accomplishment of their Wishes.

As to a Seat in the Senate, I am perfectly convinced that the weakness of my Health will not permit me to go through the fatigues of a close attention to such momentous Business. My Friends hope, will therefore excuse me for wholly declining to accept any appointment to public Office.
