When I had the pleas<sup>re</sup> of seeing you lately  
at Philadelphia I troubled you to take a memorandum of  
a Certificate of 99 dollars payable to Hannah Stone with  
Interest from 1 May 1781 - it was dated 22 May 1784  
I procured a power of attorney from the said Han. Stone
