Nov. 27. 1829

My dear Colonel,

If you can bring with
you into town tomorrow, the
little works on ~~cottages~~
architecture, I shall still
be glad to take ^{them} from you
upon the terms stated. I
have fortune to get them
elsewhere, in the hope that
you would let me have
them. I will call at the

Office tomorrow, having
many letters to read
M.

I pray you to remem-
ber me most kindly to
Mr. Ch. Pinwall, and your
group of pretty little
daughters. It was very
much my wish to have
gone out to see them
before my departure, and say
adieu; but I find the

days too short for what
I have to do in town. I
am pushing hard to get
off by the packet of the
9th of December; and
trust that I shall, if
my Dutch correspondents
will liberate me.
