I wrote to you two hours
since from Lübeck - am now
in Travemünde - "the most
of the secrets of the Trade
- ting in the open air & writing
bench of a German tavern. We
ran about this morning after
breakfast in Lübeck, looking at
the old churches, then painting
various curiosities until the
small steam boat took us -
to be regretted, for we steamed
in "His Lordship's" carriage
delightful side of 8 miles
Baltic is in sight. The
very large & comfortable -

oil in an hour. We are not
to much worried with
spurs. Again - God bless
my beloved children.
I would give the world if I
could be with them.
