It is almost dark my dear wife, but I have
light enough to say a few words to you - and
tell you I arrived here safe - after a comfortable
ride with plenty of room in the car. - It
has so happened too that I am quite in time
for the business of the Court - as it tried no case
yesterday. We began the first case after my
arrival today - I am glad to tell you that I
have not suffered from the journey -

Tell James his case will not come on this
week - but I think we shall reach by
the middle of next week - He may therefore
for the present remain quietly at home

I trust my dear Anne you have not
suffered from this uncomfortable day -
It is a sad and lonely looking evening
for men the hawks are by numerous
than usual. My own however feels still
more lonely - I miss you all sadly - one of the
girls will I hope soon write to me
