Dear Sir,

I reached this City last evening, after many days of the utmost fatigue and unsuccessful embassies. Mr. de Conneau, the lawyer employed by messrs. Babine, has treated me with every duplicity in his power, therefore no settlement and further alarms.

I left your Honor very sick in Philadelphia. His left Shoulder exceedingly Swollen and consequently exposed, to extinguish, if any way practicable, the matter accumulated in that part of his body. It is owing, to an ancient stroke he must have received by some cruel person, without the least doubt. — However, should my mare, according to your

equal value, and the cost she will have,  
know, as I shall then re-imburs  
mention and the twenty dollars,  
I have been already at some

expenses, besides what it will cost me, if the House,  
either receive or see: and have been oblig'd to get an other  
creature, which of course, has plung'd <sup>me</sup> in various  
difficulties.

I would have wrote from the  
city, but hurried in ferrows, I really could not  
find a single minute. — accept my warmest

thanks for your kind advice, and the sincere  
assurance of our affection for you and amiable

family. — I found my beloved woman and my children  
pretty well: and wish you the same felicity.
