My dear Sir,

Washington 11 Jan: 1837

The Devel's to pay about some original Land Office papers which were referred to the Judiciary Committee last session & cannot be found. On the 384<sup>th</sup> page of the Journal you will find that Mr. King of Alabama presented the Memorial of Frederick Raveries. In order to support this claim it seems the Land Office sent to the Committee a number of original papers of importance. Can it be possible they are in your possession?
