Sir: I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th of November, ult., communicating to this Department a translation of a note from Mr Osma, the Minister Plenipotentiary from Peru, requesting that the vessels of the U. S. Squadron on the Pacific station may be ordered to abstain from entering the ports of Peru which are not open to foreign commerce.
