I notice by the tenor of you last letter that you has expected me to remain with you, I am much abliged for your kind offer, but I have not thought of Doing Do, and as the time of any coming is now meetain + I should only remain 2 a 3 Days - you . much lit me stop at Willards as I menally do which will be more convenient as I have some other business to altered to - I can promise however that you will see quite enough of me if I get on; which I am again obliged to furthere as my hother in law, Ellist try low, leave on morting for Egg Harton to thook Inipe - If I left Alle I would be gente alone - therefore shall have to wait milil my low returns, who will not stay as long as the others, you need not expect me now with heport in person -I will name the Begota Birds but conto not coo so very door so not send them it present. I am happy to hear that mis Bis better.

May 11th 1869

Dear Baird

The check to pay for guns sent Hitg viz \$21 13/100 is recd & herewith I return the bill receipted, also have receipted, also have receipted the bill for the papers.

I noticed by the tenor of your last letter that you had expected me to remain with you, I am obliged for your kind offer, but I had not thought of doing so, and as the time of my coming is now uncertain & I should only remain 2 or 3 days. you must let me stop at Willards as I usually do which will be more convenient as I have some other business to attend to. I can promise however that you will see quite enough of me if I get on; which I am again obliged to forth one as my brother is lame, Elliot & my son, leave on Monday for Egg Harbor to shoot snipe. If I left Mrs L. would be quite alone. therefore shall have to wait until my son returns, who will not stay as long as the others. You need not expect me now until I report in person.

I will name the Bogota Birds but could not do so very soon, do not send them at present. I am happy to hear that Mrs B. is better.
