**Title:** Letter from Everard Bierer to Andrew Curtin

Gov. A. G. Curtin

Dear Sir. I would like to get from you the appointment of Lieut. Col. or Major in some of the Pennsylvania Regiments now organizing. I have not yet sought for any other position than the one I am now occupying, that of Captain. When the 11<sup>th</sup> Regiment Pa Res. was organized last July I was offered the Majorship of the Regiment but declined, as I preferred having more Military Experience and training before assuming any higher position than a Captaincy. I have been drilling constantly and studying hard now for over 4 months and think I am sufficiently qualified for the position sought for. I should be very much gratified - if you can give me the appointment. It is the first favor in the way of official position - Civil or Military that I have ever asked of you. Could you not give me the Lieut. Colonelcy of Genl. Howells' Regiment, which is now organizing in Fayette Co. I think my appointment would be acceptable to the Regiment. I in-

tended speaking to you on this Subject day before  
yesterday in Harrisburg. but I had but little time  
and you seemed to be much engaged.

If necessary I think I can get the Recommendation  
of Genl Mc Call. and the field Officers of  
my Regt. the 11<sup>th</sup>.

Will you please write me on the sub-  
ject and say what you can do for me?
