

PRELUDE

ENTRANCE HYMN: OH, COME, ALL YE FAITHFUL

- Oh, come, all ye faithful, Joyful and triumphant!

INVOCATION and DIALOG

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. The Word was made flesh, and we beheld His glory.

I. THE CHILD IS PROMISED

READINGS: Isaiah 11:1-10; Luke 1:26-38

HYMN: THE ADVENT OF OUR GOD

II. THE CHILD IS AWAITED

READINGS: Isaiah 40:1-11; Matthew 1:18-25

READINGS: Isaiah 9:6-7; Luke 2:1-12; John 1:14-17

HYMN: JOY TO THE WORLD!

IV. THE CHILD IS WORSHIPED

READINGS: Isaiah 42:1-4; Luke 2:13-20; Philippians 2:5-11

HYMN: HARK! THE HERALD ANGELS SING

SERMON

OFFERING

ANTHEM or SPECIAL MUSIC

CANDLELIGHTING CEREMONY

As worshipers enter the church, ushers distribute candles and drip-cards. . . . After the anthem, the minister, taking a large candle, lights it from an altar candle which symbolizes Christ, the Light of the World. Then the minister says:

Arise, shine; for your Light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. . . . And nations shall come to your Light, and to the brightness of your rising.

Jesus said, "I have come as Light into the world, that whoever believes in Me may not remain in darkness. . . . The Light is with you for a little longer. Walk while you have the Light, lest the darkness overtake you. . . . While you have the Light, believe in the Light."

The minister then gives light to the acolytes; they in turn give light to the first worshiper in each pew, who passes it on. The lighted candle is never tilted, but is always held upright when giving light to another. When all candles are lighted, the minister leads in the prayers.

THE PRAYERS and THE LORD'S PRAYER

Almighty God, You made this holy night shine with the brightness of the true Light. Grant that here on earth we may walk in the light of Jesus' presence, and in the last day wake to the brightness of His glory; through Your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Almighty God, You have filled us with the new light of the Word who became flesh and lived among us. Let the light of our faith shine in all that we do; through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Other prayers may be offered; then the Lord's Prayer is prayed by all.

HYMN: SILENT NIGHT, HOLY NIGHT!

- Silent night, holy night!
 All is calm, all is bright
 Round yon Virgin Mother and Child.

 Sleep in heavenly peace,

BENEDICTION

Almighty God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, keep you in His light and truth and love now and forever. Amen.

The worshipers' candles are extinguished when the minister's candle is extinguished.
