





## "PATTERNS: WORKS BY WOMEN ARTISTS OF COLOR"

In a joint celebration of Black History Month and Women's History Month, the Center will present the exhibit "Patterns: Works by Women Artists of Color".

"Patterns" is curated by Nataki McNeal, artist in residence at the Center, whose work will be featured in the exhibit. 
## ...Ninth Annual Lee Dubin Scholarship Fund



# Health Spotlight....

## ORGAN AND TISSUE DONATION

Are you an organ donor? If not, have you considered being an organ and tissue donor? Slightly more than 5,000 people per year die waiting for an organ transplant simply because there were not enough organs available. As of June 2001, about 77,000 people in the U.S. were on the national waiting list for an organ.

Which organs can be transplanted? Kidneys, hearts, lungs, livers, pancreases, and intestines can be transplanted. There is an organization called The Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network, that matches donated organs with critically ill patients on the national waiting list. Medical urgency, compatibility of blood chemistries, and body size are considerations in making a match.

What tissues can be transplanted? How about blood vessels, bone and bone marrow, connective tissue, corneas, heart valves, middle ears, and skin. These are just some of the tissues that can be used.

Organ donation will not change the appearance of the body for the funeral service, nor will it cost your family any money. All costs for harvesting your organs are paid for by the recipients and their health insurance.

Organ and tissue transplantation saves lives! Did you know that you can help up to 50 people? Think about it! Someday YOU could save someone's life. Say YES to organ and tissue donation when it's time to renew your driver's license. Discuss your decision with your family. Explain to them that this is your wish, to help save lives. You can download a donor card from this website: www.organdonor.gov, or call: 1-888-ASK-HRSA. If you aren't sure about organ donation, please read the information on this website, it'll help you in your decision.

Someday, somewhere, someone will appreciate the time that you spent in filling out an organ donor card, or by checking off the box on your driver's license renewal form. Be a lifesaver!
