



Health Spotlight....

What is Hepatitis C? It's a serious liver disease. It makes your liver swell up and stops it from working right. The liver is a vital organ. It fights infections, stops bleeding, removes drugs and other toxins from your blood. The liver also stores energy for when you need it.

How do you get Hepatitis C? You could get it from sharing drug needles, getting pricked by a needle that has infected blood on it, or being born to a mother with Hepatitis C; or even a blood transfusion, if it was before 1992. In rare cases, getting a tattoo or body piercings with dirty, unsterilized tools; even having sex with an infected person, especially if you or your partner has other sexually transmitted diseases; and even sharing razors. Recently, former Baywatch star Pamela Anderson claimed she got Hepatitis C from getting a tattoo.

Are there symptoms to look for? Many people with Hepatitis C do not have any symptoms. Others have flu-like symptoms, feel tired, feel sick to your stomach, have a fever, do not want to eat, have stomach pain, diarrhea, dark yellow urine, light-colored stools, yellowish eyes and skin.

Can I get tested for Hepatitis C? Go see your family doctor and ask for a blood test. A blood test will determine if you have it, and how serious it is. It is a potentially life-threatening disease!

Is there a cure? It can be treated with injections of a drug called interferon, alone or in combination with another drug called ribavirin. Some people have had to get liver transplants, like David Crosby from that famous singing group, Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young.

What can I do to avoid getting Hepatitis C? Do not share needles with anyone, wear gloves if you have to touch someone's blood, DO NOT use an infected person's toothbrush, razor, or anything else that could have blood on it. If you want to get a tattoo or body piercing, first make sure that they are a reputable shop, and second, that they use clean, sterile tools. If you have had multiple sex partners over the course of a year, it's wise to get yourself tested.
