

Health Spotlight....

HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT HIPAA?

HIPAA is the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act. If you have been to your doctor's office in the last couple of weeks, you were probably given a couple of papers to read and a form to sign saying you have received the explanantion of HIPAA and you understand it. PLEASE READ IT! SAVE IT! IT'S IMPORTANT!

HIPAA is the first major federal rule to protect the privacy of medical information. Among other things, it gives you new power to obtain your medical records, BUT, it also allows companies to pay health plans to market drugs to you. Personally, that's the part I do not like. You can thank the drug lobbyists for that.

This "privacy notice" outlines how your personally identifiable health information is used and disclosed. It will also give you details about HOW a provider interprets HIPAA rules. Your health information may be used to treat you, to collect payment, and for hospital administration. Your information may be shared to conduct research and raise funds, and to comply with requests regarding organ donation, worker's compensation, public health, and national security. Other uses may give you grounds to file a complaint.

HIPAA also contains a section about your rights regarding medical information about you, and it also tells you how to file a complaint if you feel your privacy rights have been violated. You have the right to inspect and copy medical information that may be used to make decisions about your care. This usually includes medical and billing records, but only limited access to psychotherapy notes per Pennsylvania regulations.

History of Pride

At a time not long ago, the social climate against sexual minorities made police raids very common for many of the places gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered people gathered.

But on June 27, 1969, the patrons of a small New York City bar called The Stonewall Inn fought back in a three day resistance that spilled out on the streets of Greenwich Village marking the birth of the modern gay rights movement.

Today, millions of people each year gather to commemorate this historical turning point in hundreds of Pride marches and Pride festivals throughout the world.
