

Directions to Open Stage

From Route 83

Take the Harrisburg/Front Street exit and go to Second St. Go to the second light (Market St.) and take a right. Go two lights to Fourth St. and take a left. Take a right at the next light onto Walnut St. Pass through the Third St. light and to the Walnut Street garage on the left. Open Stage is on street level.

From Route 81

Take the Harrisburg/Front Street South exit and go down Front St. passing three lights. At the fourth light, make a left onto Market Street. Pass through the light and follow the rest of the directions for Route 83.
