MEETING OF THE RURAL CAUCUS 2/7/76 chaired by Ray Stickles Angrowne) and the state of the state of the Lancaster, Pa.

(1) Walter Lear was contacted about running for public office, his response was that he vas flattered but that he would not.

(3) Gay Lobby Day workshops will be held in Pittsburgh at the Calvary Episcopal Church 1.25 on March 13, and at GAA headquarters in Phila, HOPS headquarters in State College both no 21. on March 20. The educational packet to be distributed to the legislators will be funded by GAA Phila, and the Phila. Ouakers, Lobby Day will begin at 10 am, but it was suggested that all people meet at designated places othe r than the Capitol. Probably at the YMCA at

9am. LOBBY DAY WILL BE HELD ON MARCH 23. Help has been volunteered by the Harrisburg ACLU to coordinate Lobby Day. A committee meeting had been scheduled for

248 at 1pm in Lancaster. For more information contact Sam Deetz 717-473-9923. (4) Letters were read from Ken Burke and Jerry Brennan suggesting and endorsing a council of liasons as the Rural Caucus with a permanent chairperson to make it less cumpersome and more functionable. The idea of a council was defeated, but the motion to have a permanent chairperson was accepted.

(5) Sam Deets spoke on Janet's behalf about the function of the chair which should include working with individual groups, attending various meetings and working with steering committees. The person should not be committed to more than they can handle. Ray Sticles was elected to that position by a majority vote. (6) Joe Burns passed out information packets at

(6) Joe Burns passed out information packets and reported on the Legislative Packet for Lobby Day.

(7) Donna reported on Dyketactics which held their first demonstration on Dec. 4 . The week of Jan. 31 they picketed the x-rated film "The Snuff" which was being shown in Phila. They achieved public support from passersby who joined in. The theater closed down for the rest of the day and on Thursday the theater had an injunction. there is a possibility that the film is being shown at a Phila, drive - in.

(8) Kevin Smith gave a report on his efforts with the Human Relations Act in Reading. He has met with all Councilpersons and with the mayor and now ans support from three councilpeople. He has also been gathering st ong evidence of discrimination in the Reading

area, GCS would like to introduce a bill banning discrimination against gays on a pre-counarea, GCS would like to introduce a bill banning discrimination of amend its Human Rela-til level by March. Reading could possibly be the first Pa. city to amend its Human Relations Act to include gays. They would also like to have the Council Chambers packed for the bearings. (11) Janet announced that there will be a demonstration on Feb. 28 at Independence Mall for International Women's Year. It will have a theme of "Tribunal of Crimes against Wome. Janet will be speaking about women who wanted to be physicians. Example: Agni Dici, an incient Greek woman who cross-dressed to treat women. When she was found to be a woman she was sentenced to death. She was saved by the women of Athens who joined in her de-Tense. At that point women were allowed to practice medicine in ancient Greece. (12) A documentary film will be shown at Shippensburg on Feb. 25-27 entitled

'Gertrud. ein" (13) GUL announced that it was sponsoring 'the "Seminar on Military Spending" being Stein"

held in Phila. that weekend.

(14) Sam Deetz reported on the meeting with Col. Barger of the Pa. State Police. He stated that the State Blice had not changed its policy for dealing with gays in the past 50 years, and that a task force would be set up within the police force. (15) GCS announced its Coffee House and social events (skating parties bowling etc.)

It was decided that rather than focus on SB 743, we would take a pro-gay approach. The pro-gay issue will be summarized for use by the lobbyists. The workshops will consist of an introduction to the Lobbyists' Packet, signing up for lobbying and a step-by-step rehearsal for Lobby Day. The Lobbyists' Packet is to consist of : 1/ the text of the present law, dealing with solicitation, sodomy, vagrancy, harrassment of gays, etc. R. Stickles is preparing this text. 2/position papers. Earl Greenberg, of the Justice Dept. is preparing position papers on SB 743 and on the proposed pro-gay legislation. 3/ Lobby Day schedule. 4/ copies of all anti-gay legislation. 5/ a background on gayness. 6/ the police stance.

Potential Lobbyists are also encouraged to engage in pre-Lobby Day activities, such as contacting their legislators ahead of time, or contacting the news media concerning gay issues.

The Educational Packet, which will be distributed to the Legislators, is nearing completion. The packet will include the Greenburg Position Papers, an edited form of "25 Questions and Answers on Homosexuality", and lots of endorsements as previously established.

It has been established that there will be a central gathering place for all the lobbyists to meet the morning of March 23 for coffee, fellowship, and psyching. No platforms will be available for anyone. We do not want speeches, etc. The Lobby Day Committee members will act as resource people. Probable location for this Coffee Hour is the YMCA. We will begin arriving at around 9:00 am. As lobbyists arrive, they will be instructed to call the telephone center at Harrisburg Gay Switchboard to report their arrival. There will be two phone lines available for use throughout the day. Statistical information, etc. will be available from the phone center. It will not be necessary for all lobbyists to wait around the coffee center for late arrivals. After receiving necessary instructions, etc., lobbyists should be on their way with the buissness of actual lobbying. Resource people will be on hand for a couple of hours to help late arrivals. A form will be used to answer pertinent questions as to the reactions of the legislators they saw. This info. will be tallied and kept available for future use.

To mount this incredible effort, the Gay Lobby Day Committee, composed of people from all parts of the state, is soliciting a donation from those who may be interested. Your contribution will be used to cover the costs of mailing, telephone calls, printing, and the one-day workshops to train lobbyists. All time and travle by the committee or lobbyists is volunntary and at their own expense. Will you please help the cause?
