## NOMTNATIONS AND ELECTIONS

The By-Laws designate that elections be held in Novenber for terms of one year, and nominations be open for one month prior to elections. officers are tro Co-Chairpersons (one male, one female), a Secretary, and a Treasurerc All officers must be valing menbers. Membership is deflned as any person who fittends the Caucus, ant voting membership is detined as any morabes who has attended the Caucus in the wroceodsn; six months.

Nominations may be made forencilusuritelier by self or others and may be made at any time before the actual elections.

There is considerable doubt that any of the present officars rill seek reelection, and some concern to be expressed that the Caucus has not been blessed in the past year by an overwhelining number of women. though thaee of the present officers are women.

Coples of the By-Lars will be avallable at the meetings in October and November.

## The Septamber Minutes

The September meatilig of the Rural Caweus was held at 3002 Mex bif tas Avente in Lancaster on Sato. Sept. 9th. Sixteen persons attended. Stuelness opened at 1850 .

1) Edvestion Comntittoe Mary Nancarrow Informed us that the new Secretary of Education, Carol Kline seems responsive to gay rights. The Gay Rights Advisory Committee composed of personnel from the Department of Edueation, members of the Council on Sexual Minorities and members of the Rural Caucus would soon be raact vated within PDE
2) Documentation of Discrimination Profect- Bari Weaver gave Mary and Joe two final drafts $a$ ? the project which centers on the experlences of discrimination gays feal in education. Anyone who wishes to contribute to this project may stll1 do so. No names or addresses are required on the

3） 00 mpications Comittees a discussion of modia projects once started in the Caupus led to a referral of the question of nalting Public Service Amnouncements representong the Gay Community．This committee under Bob Woods is to investigate，and if possible enact the project．

4）By－Laws Amendment－the Caucus agreed unamimousily to an amendment to the By－Lews which read，＂that the deadilne for mailing the newsletter be set at no less than fourteen days before the scheduled meeting，and if this deadline cannot be met，the Co－Chairs be notified and thereafter be responsible for no less than a simple notification by mail of the time and place of the next meeting within ten days of the meeting date。

5）Candy Sales－Bob Woods announced that he had received most of the monies from candy sales，anf that we might have a small profit．However，he had also retumed $5 \frac{1}{2}$ cases of candy to Horld ${ }^{\circ}$ s Finest Chocolates which had not been sold， and their response was that the deadine for retilin of any candy had been passed， and that the Caucus owed $\$ 36.71$ in shipping charges．Since the $5 \frac{2}{2}$ cases represents a lot of money，Bob has been instructed to reply to Ncrid＂s Finest Chocolates that they should return to us the candy we returned to thems and whon we have received $1 t$ ，we will pay the charges owed．Anyone who has not turned their money or candy into Bob，please do so immediately．

6）NOG Conference－Those Gaucus members who have volunteered for childcare and／or other services for the NOi con ecence must register for the conference． Unless one is a NO：lieraber，or has of ter good reas ons for supporting women ${ }^{0}$ s Liberation financially，it is reasons．ble to register for the volunteers to registur ior the minimum $\$ 3,00$ fee as we are rendering services．Caucus volunteers may be housed free of charge in Allentown at the homes of gay persons．Please contact Joe Burns for housingo or to volunteer to help．（437－2642） A resolution was passed for the Caucus to trke a booth at the conference for the Caucus and other gay organizations to use in desseminating information of gay groups，and to insure the gay $p$ resence．The posilibility of a bake sale （balking by men oniy）was raised and Joe Bums was to see about the bootho （NOTBs The Hotel will not permit a bake sale．And invitations are being sent to all Rural gay groups to send I1terature to pass out，or if they have items for sale to send a person who will be responsible for the sale of their items． $-\mathrm{J} o e)$ The resolution passed unanimously．

7） $\mathrm{S}_{0} \mathrm{~B}_{\mathrm{a}}$ 531－Craig Lewis，the prime sponsor，has been the target of strong letter wilting campaigns from chuches in his constituent area and has weakened his supporet of the bill．Despite the recent changes in leadership in the Senate and House，which tend to favor us，S．B． 531 w 111 not come out of Comnitteethis year．It was decided to contact the Coucil for Sexual Kinorities about stategy，but the general feeling is that the Caucus should keep pushing for 531．

8）Iural Gay Conference rescheduled for January or February，probably at a Hotel．It was decided to spend mocre money to get a big－name speaker such as Elaine Noble or Frank Kameny．（SEE BELOW－STATE COITFRRENGE）

9）HEALTH Concerns－The Caucus has received a letter confirming that Martin Rock is offictaily on the PA。Dept，of Health Advisory Cominitee on Sexual Minorities Health Concerns．

10）Social weekend（3）－we discussed having a social weekend in liovenmber． At the same tilme．Gary Norton announced that Homophiles of Williamsport is having a sinilar event ci 2ot．22nd to celebrate their first anniversary．They have sent invitativins ic all the people they have come into contact with their Pirs：yoar．Meny of these are Caucus members，others are Pemsylvania movement people who have addressed HOW，or sought them out for other reasons．They expect－ a hundred at their dinner．

11i）the next Caucus was announced for Haxrisburg（MCC－since changed）on Ootober 1st．And the Cauous adjourned at $4: 20$ 以．M．
