

Tret Fure, is one of the most prolific artists in the contemporary singer-songwriter arena. In addition to being a gifted songwriter, she is a producer, engineer, vocalist and instrumentalist. After releasing her premier album on MCA records in 1973, titled Tret Fure, and becoming one of the first women sound engineers in the US, she left the mainstream music industry. Armed with a fierce desire to retain full artistic control, Fure began exploring the independent side of the industry and soon discovered the blossoming genre known as women's music. She has been a major player in that field ever

since. She has three acoustic releases on her own label, Tomboy girl Records. She has won competitions for her songwriting and her recordings, including awards from the South Florida Folk Festival Songwriting Competition and Outvoice. Fure also markets of her own line of clothing named after her popular song Tomboy girl. With the success of this venture, she now owns a retail store in Madison, WI. In addition, she has produced a series called Music & Comedy in Madison and has hosted the successful festival, Tomboy girl Fest. An accomplished cook, Fure has also published a cookbook, Tret's Kitchen, featuring her own recipes. Along with bridging the marketing, production, and music worlds, Tret serves as Vice President on the executive board of the Local 1000 Traveling Musicians Association—a union geared toward helping traveling musicians find security and longevity. graduate degrees from Mansfield University of
Pennsylvania, the Peabody Conservatory of Music and
the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of
Music.

Jeffrey J. Cogan, accompanist, has a strong and diverse musical background. In 1981 after attending Pennsylvania State University, he enlisted in the United States Army Band Program and served until retiring at the United States Army War College. He is a graduate of the Army College of Music in Virginia. He is currently in Church Music Ministry in Central Pennsylvania and is a private music educator in piano, organ, and clarinet.
