A valuable friend and advisor to the student body of Dickinson College was Alan Coutts, former Dean of Men, whose sudden death at the age of 56 was a deep shock to all who knew him.

His ability to carry out the functions of his office as Dean of Men in a warm, friendly manner made him an effective guide to all who came to him for advice. His sincere interest in each individual student enabled him to help many Dickinsonians master their problems.

Devoted to the theater and to writing, Professor Coutts was in two Broadway plays as an understudy and actor, and in more recent years has appeared occasionally with the Allenberry Players.

Author of 200 radio dramatic scripts, many one-act plays and numerous articles, Professor Coutts also contributed to "Speech Handbook" and was the author of a speech manual for the New York Telephone Company.

In his enthusiastic support of Mermaid Players productions, his position as assistant swimming coach in charge of divers, and his participation in Student Senate activities, one can glimpse the large and vital role played by Professor Coutts in the life of the Dickinson community. It is in remembrance and deep appreciation of service to Dickinson College that the student body of 1964 dedicates this yearbook to "Dean Coutts."

THE JOSEPH PRIESTLEY AWARD

The presentation of the Joseph Priestley Award on March 19 highlighted Priestley Day, a celebration held each year at Dickinson College to honor Priestley's memory and to recognize achievements of today's men of science. The Award is a ceramic portrait of Joseph Priestley, discoverer of oxygen, and \$1,000.

The 13th recipient of Dickinson's Priestley Memorial Award was Dr. I. I. Rabi, Nobel Laureate and Columbia University scientist noted for his research in nuclear and electronic physics. Described as "one of the developers of American physics," Dr. Rabi was honored for his contribution to the welfare of mankind through physics.

Dr. Rabi is noted for his molecular beam researches and for perfecting methods for precise measurement essential for the development and testing of atomic theory. He is a leader in the international search for peaceful uses of atomic energy, serving on the Science Committee of the United Nations and the Science Commission of NATO. Dickinson College is proud to salute this outstanding scientist of our age.



THE DICKINSON COLLEGE ARTS AWARD




Leonard Baskin, *center*, with President Rubendall and Dr. Gordon, Chairman of the Department of Fine Arts.

The Dickinson College Arts Award is presented to a person who has made an outstanding contribution in the arts of humanities. Recipients are chosen by a select committee of faculty and trustee members. The Arts Award, one of the most distinguished awards presented by Dickinson College, was instituted in 1958. Previous recipients include Robert Frost, Eero Saarinen and Dame Judith Anderson.

The receiver of this year's award was the noted Leonard Baskin, presently a professor of printmaking

and sculpture at Smith College. Mr. Baskin received a Wedgwood medallion and gift of \$1000 for his reputable achievements in the fine arts. This famous American artist has received degrees from various institutions of fine arts in New York, Paris and Florence, and has been honored with numerous prizes and fellowships. Mr. Baskin has had 21 one-man shows in America and Europe, and his works are presently in the permanent collections of more than 25 museums, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York.

BONISTEEL YEAGLEY OBSERVATORY

What is perhaps the first multiple-telescope observatory at any American college or university was opened and dedicated here at Dickinson on December 13. Built at a cost of \$50,000, most of the funds were provided in a gift from Roscoe O. Bonisteel of Ann Arbor, Michigan, a Dickinson Alumnus and trustee.


The Dickinson Observatory was conceived, planned, and the construction supervised by Dr. Henry L. Yeagley. It is housed in a box-like structure suspended from the roof of Althouse Science Hall and contains, in addition to one refracting telescope, three eight-inch and three ten-inch reflecting telescopes.

Dr. Yeagley commented that "the whole purpose of our observatory is to provide more people with an understanding of what the universe is like and how man observes it." To encourage the widest possible use of the observatory by the public, it is open for public viewing four nights each week throughout the year.


PI DELTA PHI




Dallas Winslow hangs on to throw from Harry Harris.






"Just where do you think you're going?"

In the Middle Atlantic Conference college division, the Red Devils wound up in a second-place tie with a 10-5 record. Despite a slow start the cagers came on strong and finished with three consecutive wins over Franklin & Marshall, Lebanon Valley and Johns Hopkins.

Strangely enough, a defeat was the outstanding game of the year. Playing against a highly-rated and powerful Gettysburg team, Dickinson battled the Bullets' tough squad down to the buzzer, only to lose on a game-winning shot in the last second of play.






WRESTLING





A number of freshmen look very promising, and if they can fill the gaps left by graduation, D'son could have a winning season.


TENNIS





Catastrophic Blaze Kindles Excitement Along With Stores

One of the most disastrous fires in the history of Carlisle obliterated two major department stores and caused extensive damage in the center of the business section Sunday night despite the efforts of 200 firemen and volunteers from the area.

Loss has been estimated at nearly a million dollars. Completely leveled were Bowman and Company department store, 10-18 South Hanover St., Carlisle's oldest department store, and McCrory's 3 and 10-cent store next door.

The fire was discovered at 11:30 p.m. When firemen arrived minutes later the building was a mass of flames. Fire Chief Ray E. Kelley said there was no chance to save the Bowman Building and firemen directed their efforts on 15 degree temperature, the lowest of the series, to saving the McCrory and nearby stores.

Dickinson students and professors hearing the alarms could see the flames shooting almost 100 feet into the air. The blaze was only three blocks from Dickinson's Rush campus.

Many students joined weary firemen and citizens in helping to clear debris and equipment and in removing the artifacts and valuables from damaged buildings.





Approve College's Development Plans

Program To Span 10 Years, Based On Shay's Evaluation

The following is a report from the president on the special meeting of the board of trustees April 14. In brief it presents the broad ten-year program of development for Dickinson College, based on the studies of the Shay Association.

According to the report, it "is the result of months of analysis and evaluation of a variety of possible approaches to the problem under review." All the following is direct quote from the report and a memorandum.

For additional endowment funds \$ 7,000,000

For new building construction, land acquisition, renovation of certain existing buildings and demolition of others \$ 14,971,180

Total \$ 21,971,180

It is expected that of the funds needed for new construction approximately \$7,881,000 would be available through government loan if necessary. The balance would have to be raised by the College.

In considering the above ten-year Development Program, the following facts must be kept in mind:
