




# Who Gets the Money....

# ... when nearly everyone needs help?


(Editor's Note: The financial aid officer at a small, private college must be a master of the near impossible. Despite increasingly limited funds, he's called upon to meet the needs of an ever-growing number of students unable to pursue higher education without monetary assistance. Who should get the grant, the job, the loan? Should one student be given a "free ride," or should five be partially supported? Decisions like these have to be made daily, occasionally arbitrarily, which is why most people wouldn't take Chick Twichell's job for all the oil in the Persian Gulf.)

Chick Twichell considers himself a teacher, as well as the school's director of financial aid, and he is not particularly fond of autumn. It signals the arrival of 450 new students who, for various reasons, think that money grows on Washington-watered trees and Chick Twichell is the harvester.

"About the time I get the juniors and seniors straightened out on the limitations of financial aid, a new group comes in," he says with a sigh, "and the educational process starts all over again."

Twichell probably has more headaches than any administrator on campus, and for good reason.

A sizeable gap exists between students' need for financial aid and the actual dollars available, and each year the gap grows a little wider.

How big is the gap?

"Applicants to this year's freshman class who filed for assistance," Twichell says, "demonstrated a need in excess of \$1.5 million. The direct Dickinson amount of aid they will actually receive is less than one-seventh that figure - about \$214,000. This includes \$145,000 in grants budgeted from Dickinson funds, \$37,000 in loans and \$32,000 in campus jobs."

Fortunately an additional \$70,000 is expected to materialize this year from state and "unpredictable" federal funds.

These figures are just for freshmen alone, however.

"As people go through Dickinson," he points out, "more and more need financial assistance. Last year, for example, 33 per cent of the freshman class received aid, compared to 66 per cent of the seniors. Of the 337 seniors last year, 221 received some form of

aid. Of that group, 199 had on-campus jobs."

Not only are the available funds insufficient; but, as Twichell says, "The situation is complicated by the question of who in our society should get the money.

"Limited funds, particularly grant monies, place a private college like this in the uncomfortable position of choosing between low-income, predominately minority students and the middle and upper-income students who demonstrate some degree of need."

The College has made a commitment to the low-income student, but not without the sobering realization that every \$5000 award package to such a student could provide \$1000 to five middle-income students.

The result has been a noticable reduction in students from middle-income families, whose parents simply don't have the money to cover Dickinson expenses: quickly approaching \$5000 a year. The annual cost of books alone sometimes reaches \$200.

"The middle-income students caught in this squeeze are forced to solve the problem either by a change in the family's life-style or by a change in college," says Twichell.

Believe it or not, in 1950 national enrollment was equally divided between public and private schools. By the 1970's, however, the balance shifted by no small margin. About <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the nation's collegiates are now in publicly supported institutions.

In an effort to lure middle-class students back to the private campus, and reassert their prestigious nature, some small colleges are returning to the "no-need" or "merit" scholarship. But Twichell doesn't see this as the answer for Dickinson.

"Handing out scholarships based purely on academic performance is like buying good students, much like an athletic or music department might hand money to a top athlete or

musician," he believes. "How could these no-need or merit scholarships be explained to the athletic or music departments here, when they have no money to offer."

Another unfortunate result of the financial aid dilemma has been a considerable degree of inaccuracy in parents' reportage of their incomes when applying for aid.

"College is so expensive these days that you can only expect so much of the family," he says. "And once the family has made a realistic effort, then the college attempts to make up the difference."

The parents' estimate of what they can afford is based partly on their net income, and in many cases the figures they supply simply are not accurate. This was happening in so many cases, in fact, that three years ago Twichell began requiring a copy of the parents' federal income tax returns before making any awards final.

"Even with the mandatory requirement of an income statement, five per cent of the people will make a serious error (over \$2000) on their applications," he laments.

The trend in trying to fool the financial aid officer, however, follows a strange pattern.

"People at the upper end of the income scale will typically underestimate their income, while people at the lower end over-estimate," he explains. "It seems that people at the upper income levels are just more sophisticated at handling forms of this sort, and people with the lower incomes probably engage in wishful thinking."

But no matter what the family circumstances, Twichell says he "can never give them what they want; I try to give them what they need."

Inevitably there are some students who simply refuse to believe that kind, good-hearted Mr. Twichell can't arrange "something" that agrees with them.

So, by way of explanation, Twichell smilingly points to a sculpted hand that hangs motionless in the corner of his office: the five fickle fingers of fate.

#### Who Gets the Money....

The harsh statistics of high tuition and reduced financial aid are not "academic talk" to the parents of 1974, who face the reality of sacrifice. The situation is frustrating for the College, but of course intensely more frustrating for parents caught in the inflationary squeeze.

The comments below mirror the dismay of one parent, an alumnus, whose daughter decided to attend another college, primarily because of the shortage of aid available here. The note was written on the back of a Dickinson Fund reply envelope, in which a one-dollar bill was enclosed. Following is a response to the parent from Chick Twichell.

### The Plight of the Parent:

#### (Sirs:)

Enclosed is exactly 50 times what you're worth to me at this point. My daughter was blocked from her first choice by your foolish & prejudiced financial aid policy. Please do NOT annoy me with requests for money again. THIS IS THE LAST!! If you ever recognize, again, the fact that normal middle class, caucasian, hard-working people are also eligible for advanced education, let me know and I'll reconsider!!

## The Plight of the School:

#### Dear Mr.\_\_\_:


Your reaction to a system which projects a need of only \$200 for a student like your daughter certainly echoes the frustration which I have felt increasingly each year. Many of the people whose taxes support both state and federal programs of financial assistance to college students are not themselves beneficiaries of these programs, unfortunately.

Your own state imposes a further hardship by not allowing a state grant recipient to attend college outside the state and still retain the award.

College costs have increased steadily since 1958. The overall rise in public college tuition, room and board has averaged \$667, or 87%, since then. Private college costs over the same period have risen an average of \$1,776, or 133%. These kinds of increases have been managed only with difficulty and sacrifice in an economy of rising costs and income levels.

In 1968 the median income in this country was \$8,632. The current median has been estimated at about \$12,000, an increase of 39%. But the increase in educational costs has exceeded that rate in the past half-dozen years. In addition, income increases have not contributed to significant increases in spending power because of escalating costs of living.

This is the plight of the middle-income family, as you already know.

Middle-income students who are caught in this squeeze may solve the problem by family choice: that is a sacrifice or change in lifestyle if choice of college is paramount; or a change in college if the family is not willing to modify its level of living.

You have opted for the latter, as have many other families in your position. There are many statistics to illustrate the fact that the education provided by state colleges is a bargain.

Nevertheless, educational institutions themselves also face some hard choices. The choice of who is to be aided has become a critical issue of survival for some colleges and an annual one of fiscal solvency for others. The use of student aid programs to fill admissions quotas and maintain flagging prestige is once again becoming institutional policy at some schools.

The situation is so serious that some colleges have quietly returned to merit or "no need" awards in a questionable attempt to ensure a continued supply of top students in the face of a decreasing market. The problem is simple but painful: There are not enough funds available to aid both low-income students with high need and middle-income students.

Had your daughter chosen to attend Dickinson I would not have been able to increase her grant for 1974-75, but I could have helped in other ways. Campus employment to the extent of \$720 is always a possibility. In addition, I could have endorsed a low-interest student loan for as much as \$2,000.

I am sorry that I had no chance to do more for her.

## High Costs Freezing Out The Great Middle Class

(NOTE: The following column by nationally syndicated writer Tom Braden pertains to the changing role of private colleges in our system of education. Braden is a 1940 graduate of Dartmouth College, where he is currently a trustee.)

My father often complained to me that the college I had chosen to attend when I was young was the most expensive in the country. He exaggerated and I knew it. But I never blamed him. I also knew that he was making an immense sacrifice to come up with more than \$1,000 a year to send me to college. I'm not sure why he did it, whether from pride or love or belief.

At any rate, I've been grateful to him, and it saddens me to think that what he did for me cannot be done any longer by men such as he. My father was a man of modest circumstance, and for men of modest circumstance the education of their children at private colleges is now almost out of bounds.

I was looking the other day at the figures for tuition, board and room at the college I attended. The total this year is \$4,525. That's not counting books or chewing gum or travel. And the projection for the future is a 5 per cent to 6 per cent increase during each year of this decade.


Let's allow for the fact that this college is among the expensive ones and say that to send a boy or girl to an American private college is a matter of \$5,000 to \$6,000 per year and rising. Only the rich can afford this.

Much as they may dispute it—and some of them do—America's private colleges are thus becoming institutions for the very rich and—more consciously and proudly—also for the very poor.

The U.S. government helps see to the last. The bright student whose parents earn less than \$10,000 annually and who wants to go to the University of Rochester or Harvard or Chicago or Stanford or Georgetown can do so by means of governmentbacked, long-term loans. This is as it should be, and it represents a great step forward since my day in college when scholarships and loans were funded privately and were few.

But what about the very bright student whose father makes, say, \$20,000 to \$30,000 per year? The Department of Health, Education and Welfare says he, too, may get a government-backed loan and, according to the law, he may. But in practice, he very rarely does; because in practice, college admissions offices, which largely control the loans, like to use them for the students who most need them—that is, for the students who are very poor. Mostly, I think, what bothers me about what has happened to my college and others like it is that it has adopted a double standard. Its professors are preaching the virtues of scholarship and of a life of service and learning. But the tuition rates are preaching the gospel of money. If you want to send you son or daughter here, says the price schedule, go out and get rich.

So it does seem to me rather sad, and also a little dangerous. The privately endowed colleges have set a high standard over the years, and it is at least arguable that they may still offer the best chance for experiment, for new ideas and for recognition of individual distinction. But they are cutting themselves off from the great American middle class; and for them, as well as for the standards they have raised, this is a dangerous thing to do.

his past summer, a group of students and two instructors retraced in three weeks the trail that took Lewis and Clark three years to cover—without the guidance of Sacagawea.

The 16-person pilgrimage, which encompassed 7,500 miles, was half of a six-week interdisciplinary course called "The Lewis and Clark Expedition."

If the course sounds like all fun and no work, it wasn't.

The first week and a half was spent discussing the political climate and social conditions around 1800 that prompted such a journey, explains geology professor Noel Potter, who along with Chuck Jarvis, accompanied the band.

ther topics covered by Chuck Jarvis, history professor, were the various theories of frontier development and the concept of "wilderness."

Valuable resource material for the course was furnished by Mr. Shaw Mudge of Greenwich, Conn., a member of the Parents Advisory Council who now has two sons at the College. Mr. Mudge, an avid collector of early American documents and artifacts, provided the instructors and their 14 students with a wealth of papers, maps and other memorabilia related to the original Lewis and Clark expedition.

"What I did in preparation for the trip," says Potter, "was talk about the regional geology of the western United States to give a physical setting. We also talked about the climatology there, the relation between climate and vegetation and the types of animals found there.

"One other preliminary," he laughs, "was a pre-run shakedown to Pine Grove Furnace to make sure everyone could set up a tent."

F or the most part, the two-van caravan followed the original trail as close as possible, hitting the Pacific Ocean at the extreme northwestern tip of Oregon, where Lewis and Clark erected a small fort and spent a winter.

"Our main diversion," Potter relates, "was when we got into South Dakota. Instead of going north into North Dakota and through Montana along the Missouri River, we went west through the Badlands, the Black Hills and the Custer battlefield. We hit Montana on the way back."

Asked for some highlights of the trip, Potter cited the crossing of the Beartooth mountains, where the lakes were still frozen over, and the view was spectacular.

"One morning in Yellowstone," he noted, "there was frost on the vegetation and the water tap was frozen. It wasn't that uncomfortable; it just didn't take us as long to get dressed."

Following are excerpts from a number of student journals. All students in the course were required to keep track of their impressions. The photographs were taken by Professor Potter.

Others turned it into a competition, while for some it was draining and become a kind of hardship.

Planned Giving — Not Just a Game for the Wealthy

## Starting a New Tradition



A college as old as Dickinson inevitably has a wealth of traditions, both serious and lighthearted in nature. While the traditional prank of stealing the mermaid before Homecoming is well established, a more serious tradition of planned giving is just in its infant stages. In the accompanying article, Joe McHugh explains the College's interest in having more and more alumni consider the College when formulating estate plans.

(Among today's certainties are higher prices, higher taxes, and requests from alma mater for more money. The average alumnus probably pays little attention to the differences between annual giving, planned giving, special giving or capital campaign giving. There is a natural tendency to assume that a gift is a gift, and that it all goes to the same place anyway. Nevertheless, there are important differences, and fund raising success at the College is dependent on a general awareness of them. Below is an explanation of the College's "planned giving" program.)

#### By JOSEPH J. MCHUGH JR. Director of Planned Giving

Voluntary support is what keeps an independent college independent. It's what keeps many colleges doors open these days. Within the last few years, in fact, a great number of independent colleges have had to close or merge with state systems.

Every year Dickinsonians dig down deep to help with the annual Dickinson Fund, and that is essential for the continued well being of the College.

There is another very important way we can all help and that is through Planned Giving, or "Deferred" Giving as it is sometimes called.

Most of us suffer something of an "inferiority complex" when it comes to bequests, trusts, or gifts of property. We hear so much about large gifts of thousands of dollars and more that Planned Giving seems strictly the province of the rich and super rich.

Part of the problem stems from traditional literature on the subject of Planned Giving. Much emphasis is laid upon Trust funds, which generally require large sums in order to qualify for individual management. Most of these arrangements are practical and very helpful, but generally only a limited number of donors have the financial capacity to take advantage of them.


There are many equally important ways in which the individual can participate in Planned Giving on a smaller scale and with relative ease. These smaller gifts, taken together, are a mighty source of help to the College.

Planned Giving is a concept that can reach all of us, even those with modest incomes and relatively small estates.

Most estate planners rightly feel that their first responsibility is to their families and immediate loved ones; and estate planning, if wisely performed, begins early in life.

As needs and values change so, too, should estate plans. For each of us, time and fortune are only two factors to consider. Other considerations are number of dependents, marital status and special individual needs. Eventually, as these special needs are met (college for the children, for example), the planner begins to weigh other considerations.

It should be kept in mind that estate formation is an uneven process. But, the concept remains that philanthropy is an option to be exercised anytime sooner in life, later in life, or sometime in the middle—as long as it is tied in closely with a well thought-out estate plan. Obviously, Dickinsonians are concerned with estate planning as it might affect the College. Certainly, the best possible voluntary support is necessary to help Dickinson win its financial struggles.

At this point I would like to introduce you to Dickinson College's new "Legacy Plan". The Legacy Plan has been specially designed to call to the attention of alumni and friends a broadbased appeal for Planned Gifts.

The Legacy Plan is beginning this fall, concentrating on the Classes (1925 through 1950) who will hold reunions in June, 1975. Each subsequent year we will be adding new classes to our

Whatever the method or instrument used, the main emphasis of the Legacy Plan is upon participation. On Alumni Day, the five-year reunion classes will turn over to the President of the College the names of all class members who have indicated a wish to help the College through planned giving. No amounts need be disclosed, and confidentiality will of course be strictly maintained. This approach will be repeated on each succeeding Alumni Day.

The Legacy Plan is an exciting new concept—a new approach that we feel certain will be attractive to a much larger number of long-term donor prospects, and will help greatly to assure Dickinson's strength in her third century of service to the nation and the world.

## Nabbing the Dogfish For Fun and Profit

Shaw and Grant Mudge '76 and '78 shared an unusual summer job this year catching dogfish in Maine.


The toothless dogfish, cousin to the shark, has long been considered a nuisance to both sportsmen and commercial fishermen, useless as either a foodfish or source of byproducts.

Nevertheless, the lowly dogfish has come into its own recently as a biology lab specimen. The dead fish is useful if properly injected with latex dyes, which flow through the veins and make it easy for students to identify its anatomical structure.

So Shaw and Grant decided to supply dogfish on a commercial basis to Ward's Natural Science Establishment in Rochester NY. Working with a friend, the Mudges could catch and process about 150 dogfish a day. At the going rate for dogfish, this netted each worker \$30-\$35 per day after expenses. Actually, catching fish was the easy part of the job. Using herring from a nearby cannery as bait, the boys could gather in a day's take in an hour or so. The remainder of each day was spent injecting and preserving the fish.

According to newspaper reports, dogfish are exploited in Europe as standard fare for fish and chips. But Americans have not yet acquired similar tastes. And until they do, the species should be abundantly available for junior entrepreneurs like the Mudges.

## **Pioneer in Sex Education**

Mrs. Alice Eastlake Chew '39 has helped pioneer a sex education course at Santa Monica (CA) College. Mrs. Chew, of the College's life science department, said the new course deals with anatomy, reproduction, pregnancy, birth and disease prevention, though the emphasis is on "understanding human sexuality."

According to Mrs. Chew, it took a long time and a lot of red tape to get the administration to agree that human sexuality was a needed course, though about 50 community colleges in California now have similar offerings.

"Evidence of the urgent need for sex education," she says, "is found both in the prevalence of sex-related personal problems in the adult population and in the response of students to suitable instruction where it is offered."

"Higher education should enrich lives," she adds, "not merely train heads and hands."

## Sophomore's Initiative Rewarded

Susan Rose '77 was recently presented the "Duke of Edinburgh Award for her "initiative and perserverance" while an American Friends Service exchange student in New Zealand. The award was signed by Prince Philip and presented by New Zealand's ambassador to the United States.

Susan, believed the first American to receive such an award, undertook a variety of activities while "down under," including learning the Maori language and dance; participating in expeditions in the Tararua Mountain Range; and entertaining New Zealanders with an authentic American Halloween Party.

She is the daughter of the Rev. Dr. and Mrs. Kenneth Rose, Classes of 44 and 45, of Wilmington DE.

Tim Welsh '71 was recently written up by United Press International for his observations on "the incredible environmental education" he acquired while working as a garbageman on Cape Cod.

## **Education Continues at Sea**

Steven E. Davis '72, and his wife Barbara are teaching social studies aboard the Statsraad Lehmkuhl, a "campus afloat" for the Oceanics School of New York.

The 22-sail, 316-foot bark is serving as classroom for one hundred teenagers enrolled in a work-travel-adventure program to supplement traditional high school education.

The ship was scheduled to set sail in Norway and move down along the European coast to West Africa. Each day, academic studies alternate with the ship's watches, and students participate in all shipboard duties from scrubbing the decks to climbing aloft on "ratlines." Students spend a month in seamanship training in Norway prior to departure. This semester Davis is teaching a world food production course. His students will have an inland field trip in Gambia to work on the drought and famine topic. Davis holds a masters in teaching degree from Reed College, Portland OR. Both he and his wife studied in the Institute of European Studies program in Vienna, Austria.

Barbara Thome '61 has achieved prominence as a professional lyric soprano in the operatic circles of Europe.

# College Taps Alumni for Help in Recruiting

## alumni-admissions program initiated

Alumni from several regions throughout the country are helping the admissions office this fall as the result of a newly initiated alumni-admissions program.

A total of 15 representatives are now helping organize "College Nights," distributing information, and providing interviews for students who cannot travel to Carlisle for a campus visit.

Admissions counselor Bob Thomas, who set up the program with the help of Alumni Secretary George Stehley, said most of the schools with which Dickinson competes for students have similar arrangements.

To acquaint the alumni with current goings-on at the College, a two-day workshop was held earlier in the fall. Representatives had a chance to question a four-man panel of administrators and faculty: George Allan, dean of the College; Robert Barr, dean of educational services; Philip Nicoll, preprofessional advisor; and Dave Watkins, coordinator of physical activities. A panel of students also answered questions on such topics as counseling, post-college placement, housing, fraternities and academic and social opportunities. The alumni were also curious as to why students select Dickinson and how they first hear about the school.

Thomas noted that as a result of the workshop alumni were not only acquainted with the mechanics of the new program, but left the campus with up-to-date information, impressions and suggestions.

He added that a program of this type is especially important because of a declining applicant pool.

"The admissions office formerly depended on the applicants themselves to initiate contact with the College," he explained, "but today there are more students delaying entry, going to technical schools, or choosing other alternatives besides liberal arts education.

"We are constantly trying to locate and identify new potential," Thomas added, "and the alumni-admissions program should help us maintain the numbers and quality of students who come to Dickinson."
