

It was HOT, in the Philadelphia storefront as well as outside. There were folding chairs, worn floors, and white walls with someone's art tacked up. An insistent beat of music accented happy cries as people ran to say hello with hugs and kisses.

Four Dickinsonians read their poetry that night in Philadelphia and the work of another. This was a celebration of people enjoying the creative spark in each other. The evening was the essence of summer, lightness and laughter and good friends.

Mary Cappello '82

Someone recently told me that art is a lonely profession. I could only think that this is one of the reasons that the Arts House was initiated—not for reasons of elitism, since surely the artist will remain alone through his unique expression, but for the need of support and encouragement which are necessary in order for growth or learning to take place.

To experience a "liberal education" the student needs exposure to the arts in the classroom, but also among peers and professors in a living and freethinking environment. The arts fulfill a social, cultural, and intellectual need for the student pursuing an openminded education. To the artist, survival means the ability to share work and to receive active response to it through an audience.

Several students on the Dickinson

Campus found the environment lacking in extensions to the classroom and felt that a cultural center should be established where students can live, interact, and build, using the materials learned in the classroom along with their interest in or participation in the arts. Organizations such as the literary magazine, Fine Arts Society, and dance theater reach relatively few people on campus and many people, if asked, would not even know that the organizations exist.

Nearly 100 students responded last Spring to requests to support an Arts House. This Fall one has been established in Biddle House with approximately 30 coed residents.

Perhaps the most important function of the Arts House is impromptu gatherings of musicians, poets, artists, and friends, which are currently occurring there. This year, *Belles Lettres* and the Fine Arts Society will be working together at the Arts House in order to boost interest and to restore the Belles Lettres Society to a literary organization, not merely a group of people who critique and proofread material in order to publish a magazine.

This summer I gave a poetry reading with three other Dickinson students in Philadelphia. The reading was a rare event for me because we had all written poetry either directly for each other or inspired by the sharing of our art at Dickinson with each other. Though each of us projects a different voice, our poetry is, to a great extent, a result of our support for each other and our shared learning experience at Dickinson. The Arts House will make it easier for creativity to thrive—a place which will reflect the values supporting a liberal arts education.

Instead you are sitting inside


- satisfied with a book

John Barth On Campus

The 1980 Dickinson College Arts Award established in everyone's mind the value attributable to living art and post-modernist fiction. For two days in September, the campus had the pleasure of being host to the 11th recipient, the novelist John Barth, an event both intellectually stimulating and entertaining.

John Barth is widely acknowledged as one of America's foremost living novelists and is best known in this role. He is, in addition, the Alumni Centennial Professor of English and Creative Writing at The Johns Hopkins University. Throughout his stay at Dickinson, Barth displayed an infectious enthusiasm for teaching and was very willing to explain the techniques involved in the production of major works of fiction.

Works concentrated on during Barth's visit were taken from an early stage of his writing career, and it became very obvious that he has come a long way since his first success, *The Floating Opera*, written in 1955. Barth's self-critical attitude is evident in his latest work, *Letters*, published in 1979, which reworks a number of themes and characters to bring them more into line with his present feelings.

Whilst he expressed a regret that American writers no longer enjoy the 19th century tradition of mass leadership, Barth was evidently satisfied with his own position. Through being resident in, and speaking at, various colleges, he is able to be in close contact with at least a part of his audience.

Barth's first engagement at Dickinson involved a discussion with all students participating in the American core courses. The End of the Road, written in the 50s, was the basis for the discussion, but Barth also took the opportunity to express his admiration for other writers such as Vladimir Nabokov.

He declined an invitation to attend

the first event scheduled as part of his visit, a showing of the 1979 film version of *The End of the Road*. Barth explained that he had had no control over or involvement in the film's production, a situation brought about by his fear of an alien medium and now much regretted.

Later on that day, Barth took the trouble to address all students interested in creative writing and specifically the craft of fiction. An informal discussion took place in the lounge of Dickinson's latest "theme" house, The Arts House, formerly known as Biddle. Approximately 40 students participated in an involved and stimulating dialogue from which both sides evidently benefited. In addition to a readiness to share his knowledge, Barth also demonstrated a rare sensitivity to criticism whenever it emanated from an able critic or a perceptive reader.

He had a few words of warning, too, for the would-be author. Barth said that a novelist must now assume himself to be in the position in which the poet has traditionally been placed; he must expect little or no financial reward for his efforts. Barth said he only became a writer after acknowledging to himself his complete lack of talent as a musician, a realization that it is only technique and not genius which can be taught.

Barth's strenuous vocal schedule at Dickinson was mercifully punctuated by an excellent dinner, where he joined with some 50 staff and students as the guest of President and Mrs. Sam A. Banks. Later in the evening came the climax of his residency at Dickinson, the award ceremony in Anita Tuvin Schlechter Auditorium.

Prof. Thomas L. Reed, Jr. of the English department gave a brief outline of Barth's career and reputation before President Banks presented the recipient with the plaque and honorarium which are the award.

The Arts Award was initiated in 1959 in honour of William W. Edel, then president of Dickinson College. Presented in recognition of unique and meritorious achievements in the arts by an individual or group, it is not necessarily awarded on a regular basis. In the past, the award has gone to such notables as W.H. Auden, The Philadelphia Orchestra, and Zelda Fichandler. The plaque has a specially designed and manufactured medallion made by the Wedgwood group of Stoke-On-Trent, England. Designer of the award was the American sculptress Nancy Dryfoos, and it was modelled by Mr. Thomas Harper at the Barlaston works.

Conclusion of the ceremony was the reading by Barth of what he admitted was a "totally unproducible" television play. Explaining that earlier in his writing career he had produced the story of a lone spermatozoen in its desperate quest for an ovum, he now expressed a desire to redress the balance. This recent play concerns the parallel tale of two female ova and their attitudes to the process in which they are engaged. It is a tragi-comic love story saved from flippancy by the sensitivity of its telling and a structural evaluation of several traditional fictive forms.

The final event of Barth's visit was an open reception in Drayer Lounge, and it provided a lively debate as to who should assume the major roles in the play. The novelist meanwhile mixed freely with the staff and students alike.

An Internship in Arms Control

To augment its already varied academic opportunities, Dickinson College encourages students to take advantage of off-campus study experience in the United States and abroad. About 100 miles south of Carlisle lies one of the richest environments for students interested in the formulation and application of government policy, Washington, D.C.

Under the general title of the Washington Semester Program, the American University offers semester opportunities in American Government, Urban Studies, Foreign Policy, Economic Policy, Justice, and American Studies. Basically the Washington Semester is three fold: a seminar, where students meet and question the policy makers; an independent research project; and finally an internship experience.

The latter component is truly the most important and the most exciting. Washington offers an unlimited supply of government agencies and private organizations that always need freshminded and ambitious interns. Each student has total responsibility for locating and securing the internship. It is left up to the individual to make those two days a week at the office worthwhile and educational. Last fall the most meaningful days during my week were Mondays and Tuesdays, the days I spent at 11 Dupont Circle during my internship.

The fall of 1979 was a perfect time for a Russian and Soviet Studies and political science major to be in Washington. The Senate Foreign Relations Committee was in the midst of its decision on the second accord of the Strategic Arms Limitation Talks (SALT II), and it appeared that they would send the treaty up to the Senate floor at any moment for ratification. I was determined to find an internship that would bring me close to the action of this important agreement that has such tremendous effect upon the future of U.S.-Soviet relations.

The most promising offer came from the Arms Control Association, one of the member organizations of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. ACA is a nonpartisan, membership organization promoting public understanding and awareness of arms control and disarmament issues. The correspondence I received in the summer seemed too good to be true. During my first week in Washington, I set up an appointment and went to the office. After meeting my future supervisor, there was no doubt in my mind that I had found a great internship.

My internship supervisor, Gloria Duffy, was the communications director for the Association. Her primary job was to edit the monthly newsletter, Arms Control Today, as well as to maintain a press briefing program to ensure that the members of the Washington press corp were abreast of the most important arms control issues of the day.

She immediately reminded me of the "girl next door." It didn't take long to discover, however, that she was extremely knowledgeable in many areas of arms control. Her overloaded work cubicle represented years of reading and learning.

Our relationship quickly developed beyond the level of supervisor and intern. Perhaps it occurred due to a common interest academically and personally, that of the Soviet Union. Occasionally we exchanged a few choice words of Russian, reminding me of days spent on Moscow's busy streets, instead of merely breaks from the normal office routine. But our bond

might also have developed because we were women involved in a subject area that is dominated by men. This does not imply in any way that there is discrimination against women in arms control. It is just a field that few women find attractive. In fact, Gloria was once interviewed for a study as one of only a handful of women across the country involved in arms control.

I noticed the abundance of men at the first press conference sponsored by the Association that I attended. During the conference, I glanced around the table. The turnout of reporters was low, but all present were men. Gloria and I were the only women in the room. I listened intently when my supervisor raised a note of clarification. Her tremendous knowledge was apparent immediately.

From that day on, I felt the need to be overly prepared to answer any of the questions that were asked by the public and press. The work of the Association was set up so that all of the interns were able to spend most of the day reading and briefing themselves in various subjects. In the beginning, I felt guilty just sitting around digesting one article after another. But once I understood the importance of the educational and informational functions of the Association, I became very anxious to gain as much knowledge as possible.

The office ran smoothly despite the fact that we had no formally established hierarchy of power. I chose a private organization because I didn't want to be at the bottom of a totem pole. However, I did think that as a volunteer, two-day-a-week intern, I would have a less important relationship to the work than did the full time interns paid by the Endowment. But, with the exception of our executive director, William Kincade, and Gloria, everyone was treated on an equal basis.

Therefore, our daily work became a

unique combination of independent research and group tasks. Many days we were all off in our own corners reading and working on projects. But when there was a pile of information requests, we all did our share. One of the senior interns would hand out several requests to each of us to work on, regardless of whether we were full time or part time, graduate or undergraduate interns.


There were even times when the lines of authority between our director and the interns seemed nonexistent. If Mr. Kincade needed solutions to an administrative problem or a new approach to help sell the dying SALT treaty, he would call us all into his office for a brainstorming session. We often proved that the old saying "two heads are better than one" holds true when it comes to arms control. Not only did we support Bill in the office, we also served as back-ups the day he testified before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. It was a great thrill to sit behind Bill as he addressed them. Unfortunately only two senators woke up early enough to see ACA out in force.

My semester started to fly by quickly, but the SALT ratification process started to drag on indefinitely. As the debate raged, the interns started working more independently than ever. My superiors were unable to give me much guidance because their time was filled with preparing more articles and giving more speeches than they had planned for the fall.

Yet this independence was perhaps the most valuable experience that an intern could have received. I was given the freedom to carry on my own research and am still doing it to this very day. At the present time a career in arms control seems likely as I look into the future beyond my four years at Dickinson. The Washington Semester Program was an important beginning to a new direction in my life.

<u>The College</u> New Advisor

International financier Otto E. Roethenmund has been appointed to a threeyear term on the Dickinson College Board of Advisors.

In making the appointment, William S. Masland, chairman of the Board of Trustees, said, "Roethenmund brings to the Board of Advisors broad dimensions of economic expertise which will be very important to the board's mission of providing advice and consultation to the president of the College and the Board of Trustees."

Roethenmund was born in Thun, Switzerland, in 1928. He was educated in Swiss schools, including the University of Neuchatel where he studied economics and was graduated in 1948.

In 1951 he joined J. Henry Schroeder Banking and Trust Corporation, NYC, a leading international bank, where he began to concentrate his career on



foreign exchange activities as well as international banking. Roethenmund later joined the Deak-Perera Group, oldest and largest foreign money exchange firm in the Western Hemisphere and opened offices in the U.S. and Far East.

Named a partner of the Deak-Perera Group in 1962, he returned to the USA with the additional title of vice president of Deak & Co., Inc., the holding company for the Deak-Perera Group. He was named senior vice president in 1968, executive vice president in 1974, and appointed vice chairman of the board of directors in 1979.

In 1969, Roethenmund was elected to the board of directors of Bankhaus Deak & Co., Ltd., Vienna, Austria and in 1975 became president and a director of Deak-Perera International Banking Corp., Stamford, Conn. He became a member of the board of directors of Utica Bankshares Corp. and Utica National Bank and Trust Co., Tulsa, Oklahoma.

His daughter Denise is a member of the freshman class.

Libby Dies

Willard F. Libby, Priestly Award recipient in 1959, died during September in California. Mr. Libby won the 1960 Nobel Prize in chemistry for developing the radioactive carbon-14 dating process.

At the time Dickinson honored him, he was the scientific member of the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission. As a member of the Manhattan Project during World War II, he developed the gaseous-diffusion process for separating the isotopes of uranium.

A physical chemist, Mr. Libby's scientific interests ranged from environmental matters and planetary atmospheres to the peaceful use of the atom. He devoted much of his time to efforts to harness atomic power in the Atoms for Peace program.

Professor Dies

Amos Benjamin Horlacher, professor emeritus of English, died September 25, just one day following his 78th birthday.

Professor Horlacher came to Dickinson in 1947 as an associate professor of English and the first Dean of Men ever appointed at the College. President Sam A. Banks called him, "warm, forthright, of a perennially youthful spirit, he won widespread respect and affection during his ten years as a dean and 26 years as a highly popular and effective teacher." His colleague Frank Warlow says scores of alumni remember his acumen and the enthusiasm with which he offered World Literature classes, "the omphalos of his professional life."

Professor Horlacher's service to the College included the coordination of a comprehensive 2¹/₂-year academic study



in the early 1960s. The study led to major curricular changes, and brought to Dickinson what College Historian Charles Sellers called "a sense of selfrealization and new health... a reaching out to new disciplines, new alliances with other institutions, new direct contacts with foreign lands and civilizations."

Mrs. Horlacher is at 681 West Louther Street, Carlisle 17013. A memorial service was held in Old West on October 2.

Hall of Fame Adds 14

Fourteen pioneer Dickinson College athletes who achieved success on Red Devil courts and fields from the 1880s and 1920s were inducted into the Dickinson Sports Hall of Fame during halftime ceremonies at the football game Saturday, September 27.

"We are honored to be able to induct these outstanding athletes into Dickinson's Sports Hall of Fame," says Goby Gobrecht, Dickinson alumnus and former Red Devil football coach. "Each of these men made very important contributions to the development of athletics at the college and later made noteworthy achievements in their community."

This first of the inductees is the father of intercollegiate football at Dickinson, Willard G. Lake, a member of the class of 1887. William F. Patton, member of the class of 1892, was perhaps the best all-around athlete of his day. He played four years of football and baseball, excelled in tennis and track, and was a member of the gym team. Another member of the class of 1892, Henry M. Stephens, was also a football standout and active as a leader in many campus clubs and organizations.

Carlisler Ruby Vale, a member of the class of 1896, captained the 1895 football team. Following Vale as captain of the Red Devils in 1896 was C. Oscar Ford who holds the college kicking record with 75 points.

George W. Pedlow captained the 1900 team after serving in the Spanish-American War. Active in baseball and football, Edwin F. Hann, a 1901 graduate of Dickinson, captained the Dickinson "eleven" in 1899. William L. Stanton, a member of the Dickinson class of 1903, captained the '02 football team and ran on track and relay teams. James A. Betts, class of 1904, was captain of track and relay teams in 1903 and 1904, set several school running records and lettered in football in 1902. Also outstanding in track as well as football, basketball, baseball, and tennis, was Victor M. Boell, class of 1911, who's been termed Dickinson's greatest all-around athlete since fabled Cap Craver.

Perhaps one of the most unique contributions to Dickinson College athletics came from E. Walter "Perk" Long, class of 1911. As a student, Long was a fine baseball player. As an alumnus, he assisted in the enrollment of nearly 100 scholars and athletes, several of whom went on to lead Red Devil teams.

Another outstanding football star, John L. Felton, captained the team in 1910. Four-year football letterman, Carl B. Shelley, member of the class of 1917, is described as a small, but tough, athlete. The final name on the roster of pioneer athletes at Dickinson is Robert Paul Masland, a member of the class of 1919. Football lineman and a three-year letterman, he helped coach the Red Devils in 1920.



The first comment I hear when I tell people I have gone back to school is a shocked, "What! You didn't go to college?" and in a tone of voice reserved for comments such as "What! You have two heads!", the second remark follows quickly— "What on earth are you doing that for? What possible good will it do for you?" And although they don't say it, I hear "at your age" after that question.

I'm always nonplussed at this point and stutter around, but finally find my tongue and say "I'm going to school again because I've always wanted to, and yes, I agree — it probably won't change my life very much, but I am finding great satisfaction in having such a challenge and such a goal each morning when I get ready for classes." I truly believe that a very great joy in one's later life is the pursuit of learning.

Each year of my life I have made an effort to learn something new. The menu has been a varied one — child psychology, Arthur Murray, ballroom dancing, music appreciation, automobile care, making silver jewelry, digital computer programming, public speaking, sailing lessons and other courses I can now no longer remember.

In 1965 I read of the Adult Education program at Goddard College and wrote for information. My demonstrable credentials included one year at Dickinson College, Carlisle, Pennsylvania and a two-year legal secretarial course at a Philadelphia

business college. I found that requirements for the degree at Goddard would entail two years study. I had been researching and compiling records for 16 years for a book on Vermont silversmiths, clock and watch makers and decided that I would prefer to spend the next two years finally writing that book. It was published in 1970.

However, I still continued with educational courses at night until 1973 when I read of the Trinity College PACE program. Again I decided that I would prefer to organize, edit, and publish through our local historical society booklets on each of the 17 towns in Chittenden County as a Bicentennial project, so again I put off plans for college. "Look Around Chittenden County" was published in 1976.

Some of the courses I had been taking over the years were UVM summer school courses and it seemed like a good idea to go at my program more seriously, do all the class homework and exercises, take the exams and try for credit. When I decided to put together all my credit hours, I realized that I had a good start on the required 122, so I made an appointment with Continuing Education to see if I could go for my degree at UVM. I was referred to Barbara O'Reilly, Assistant Dean of Student Affairs, in the College of Arts and Sciences. We discussed my background and I mentioned that what I really wanted was a Bachelor of Arts in History from the University of Vermont, but I had heard that it was impossible to get such a degree from the College of Arts and Sciences. She looked at me for a moment and then said, "Nothing is impossible." Those words were the stimulus I needed.

I now began to "collect" credits as I had collected Vermont silver spoons in the past. I wrote for my transcript from Dickinson; I wrote to Pierce Junior College for their catalog and picked out all the courses I had taken in the legal secretarial course and matched them up with UVM courses, which I then "challenged". Except for the shorthand and typing, the other courses were eligible for credit. At this point my papers were turned over to Sue Perkins, Records Specialist in the office of the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and it was she who guided me through the academic maze. My credits from the summer courses were transferred to my record; I combed my scrap books, found the exams and exercises from the courses I

had taken years before, wrote to the professors asking that credit be given for them. I received credit for my writings from the History and Psychology departments and so three by three credit hours at a time, I became a junior at UVM.

In the meantime I enrolled in regular UVM courses. My high school schedules had never allowed me to take Latin and over the years I really felt deprived, so I enrolled for beginning Latin and continued it the next semester. The Historic Preservation and Commercial Archaeology courses, three hours every Tuesday night, gave me credits toward my history major. Inasmuch as I already had six UVM geography credits, I decided to make that subject my minor. However the only geography subject that fitted into my 1980 summer schedule was Remote Sensing-which is a view of the environment from space. So without the proper math, geometry or geology background I decided to try it and came away with a B-minus and a deep and abiding respect for Landsat and the other satellites in space that are giving us such an incredible new look at our world.

This fall I will take Latin again, one more geography and a final history course, and if all goes well I will graduate in December — just 51 years after I started college! If you are thinking of going back to school, my advice is "Try it, you'll like it."

1911 - Mrs. BEULA VAN BLAR-COM, widow of MARTIN '11, died in July in the Briarcrest Nursing Home, Ossining NY, at the age of 91. She attended Dickinson Preparatory School and Irving Conservatory of Music. Mrs. Van Blarcom was a member of the Yorktown Garden Club, the Ossining Woman's Club, the Briarcliff Senior Citizens Club, the Ossining United Methodist Church, and was a charter member of the Phelps Memorial Hospital Auxiliary. She is survived by a daughter and four grandchildren.

A. WELLINGTON 1912 TAWES, brother of MARVIN H. TAWES, SR. '26, died at his home in Crisfield MD on October 9 at the age of 91. He was the older brother of the late Governor J. Millard Tawes.
