Dear Mr. Spahr:

I was very happy to find your letter here on returning from a few days of work in Philadelphia. I am trying hard to finish my Franklin-portraits book this summer - or at least get it within sight of completion - and am going up to Yale for the purpose at the end of this week. Your note on the new Conway letter came this morning. I have sent the memo on it to Dr. Malcolm, and shall await its arrival with much interest. The Mr. Brown to whom Conway writes is probably Alexander Brown, author of The Genesis of the United States, published in 1891.

The miniature of Taney offered us by Miss Helena L. Pinkney of Washington (with an "assist" from her friend, Miss Mary Mason Lee) has also just arrived. It is on ivory, a charming, original life portrait, painted I should say, 1840-45, and I very much hope that you can give it to us. I shall have it photographed for you. It comes in a daguerrectype case obviously not meant for it, since there is an original daguerrectype someone else underneath. It was given to Taney by Marian Campbell, who later married Samuel Laurence Gouverneur, Jr. She must have been a daughter of James Mason Campbell, the Baltimore lawyer who was Taney's favorite son-in-law. I shall try to get from the ladies further details on the family history, as our biographies of Taney are not very helpful. Miss Pinkney is asking \$150.00 for the miniature, which seems to me a very reasonable price.

As for the Wayne material about which I wrote you, the Hirschl and Adler Gallery is sending us (this is my fee for expertising the portrait) some school books from the Wayne attic, possibly Isaac Wayne's, and photostats or microfilm of the old War Department letter books.

In the meantime, all goes well in the Library as a whole though we have s ffered from the long illness of Art Kahler's son,
and our clerical assistant of several years' standing, Nell Barr,
has been taken very seriously ill, and will probably not return
to library work. A young fellow has come is as assistant to
Arthur Flandreau in the Reference Department. We are expecting
four ranges of steel stack which will enable us to enlarge the
Reference Room, and to bring down important runs of periodicals now
stored in the attic. One eye still, of course of the ex-Chapel.
