BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Earl Eugene Rahn was born on September 27, 1887 in Weavertown, PA to John P. and Maggie DeTurk Rahn. His family lived in Douglassville, PA, and he attended school at Reading High School and Perkiomen Seminary.

Rahn enrolled at Dickinson College in September 1909. While a student, he was a member of the Phi Kappa Sigma fraternity, the YMCA, and the Comus Club. He joined the Union Philosophical Society, serving for a time in the position of the society's Critic. Rahn joined the *Dickinsonian* newspaper staff and was stage manager for the Dramatic Club. Within the athletics program, he was a member of the class track team, served as assistant manager for the baseball team, and held the position of assistant gymnasium manager. In 1910, Rahn recited "The Old Man" by Eugene Field and won first prize in the Department of Oratory's contest for men. He graduated in 1912 after three years of study.

After college, Rahn served as principal at Ontelaunee Vocational School near Reading, PA. He served in France as a Second Lieutenant during World War I where he saw action at St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne. He died on Oct. 18, 1918 from wounds received in Cunel, France. He is buried in St. Paul's Church Cemetery in Amityville, Berks County, Pennsylvania.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

This Earl Eugene Rahn collection is housed in one document box and contains two series: Scrapbook and Loose Items. The Scrapbook comprises the bulk of the collection. It was created by Rahn while a student at Dickinson College between his enrollment in Sept. 1909 and his graduation in May 1912. The scrapbook includes primarily photographs and photograph

postcards that depict people, places, and events at Dickinson, as well as in his hometown of Weaverville, PA. Few of the people in the photographs are identified, but they appear to include Rahn himself, his close friends, and members of his family. The Loose Items series contains a formal portrait, likely that of Rahn, and a small news clipping. Both came loose from the scrapbook and are stored separately in folders.
