BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Eleanor T. Waugh Hanley was born to Emma and Karl Tinsley Waugh. Her father became the president of Dickinson College in 1932 and resigned in 1933. Hanley lived in California for a time, where she attended Ramona High School. She spent her freshman year at Wesleyan University in Ohio. After one year of school there, she transferred to Dickinson College as a member of the class of 1935, although she did not graduate. During her time at Dickinson, Hanley was a member of several women's sports teams, including the swim team, the basketball team, the archery club, and the hockey team. In addition to athletics, she participated in many other extracurricular activities. She was a member of the McIntire Literary Society and the debate team. Hanley also participated in the orchestra, glee club, and dramatic club. She married James A. Hanley and had one daughter, Janet. Hanley died on October 4, 1940, after being severely burned a few days earlier when the family home caught fire. She died in the hospital of pneumonia while recovering from her burns.

COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

The Eleanor T. Waugh Hanley collection is housed in a single box and divided into three different series: College Course Papers, Secondary Education Papers, and Miscellaneous. The College Course Papers series is a compilation of papers from Waugh's career as a student at Dickinson College. The papers are on college subjects such as biology, Bible studies, botany, civics, English, German, oral expression, and sociology. This series is arranged in alphabetical order according to academic subject and includes such things as sketches, notes, papers, and exams.

The second series is a combination of Eleanor's papers from her secondary education career. The folders in this series are also arranged in alphabetical order according to academic subject. The subjects included in this series are American history, English, history, history of art, and Latin. In the series are such things as poems, exams, essays, and notes.

The last of the series is one of miscellaneous papers. In this series, a junior high year book, a letter to Eleanor, and a class schedule can all be found.
