I congratulate you especially upon keeping up with the times in improved spelling, which is making its way, especially in our Western States, the latest convert being the University of Wisconsin, which resolved upon its adoption. I notice that no less than five Chicago publications of the newspaper and magazine class have adopted your standard in the main. I placed the new Standard Dictionary at my side - a sure refuge in the day of trouble with our exceedingly rich but most irregular language, which however is being slowly yet surely improved.
