My Dear Sir

I wrote you a letter last night about my [illegible] in the Westminster Bank and I find this morning I must trouble you with another letter—

You have I presume heard of the unfavourable affair in which Romeo's son William was supposed to be engaged. I hope I shall get him out of this [illegible] but in the mean time he is charged as an accessory & it is necessary that he should appear. In my absence Mrs. Taney in her alarm sent him out of the way. He is now at his mothers in Frederick.—May I ask the favour of you to send him to me by the stage of Thursday—We gave enough

to pay his fare & I will repay you when I come to Frederick—If you find any acquaintance in the stage to whose care you can commit him, it would perhaps be as well in order to avoid accidents. If it does not give you too much trouble be pleased to say an encouraging work to two to this mother who I take for granted is lady distressed. -Send him if possible by the stage of Thursday.
