Departed this life on Thursday morning, the 15th of October [1835]; at his residence in Buckingham, John Wilson M.D. in the 68th year of his age.

The deceased inherited a mind of sterling power; by assiduity and perseverance (unaided and unassisted), he not only attained the highest academical honours, but acquired the best medical education our Country could bestow.

Thus qualified, he commenced the practice of his profession; in a short time, he obtained a proud pre-eminence; and through a series of years to the period of his decease, stood unrivalled in this section of country.

The opinion universally entertained by his Fellow Citizens of his sagacity and talent, the deference paid him by his medical brethren, stand as imperishable monuments of his fame and reputation.

To those who had the pleasure of his acquaintance, a delineation of his equanimity of manner and courtesy of demeanour (especially in a sick room), would be a work of supererogation; suffice it to say that his intercourse with mankind, was distinguished on all occasions, by a politeness of address and equanimity of deportment, rarely equalled, never surpassed.

In the most critical situations, his presence of mind never forsook him, and whether performing the most delicate and dangerous surgical operation, or calling into requisition the lessons of experience to combat a destructive malady, he was equally undaunted and undismayed.

That this composure and intrepidity was the result of deficient sensibility, the whole tenor of his life emphatically denied; it was the subjugation of feeling at the shrine of duty, the effect of a victory so essential for a physician, yet so rarely attained. The tact he displayed in discovering the seat of disease, and the judgment manifested in prescribing means to arrest its progress, were the strongest evidence of the superiority of his intellect and its ample cultivation.

To the living testimonials of his science and skill, may be safely left the guardianship of his professional reputation, and it needs not the futile effort of an obituary notice to sustain and perpetuate.

By his decease, Society has lost a most valued valuable member, and the Faculty one of its brightest ornaments; to the dispensation of an overruling Providence it is our duty (however painful the fact) to submit; firmly hoping and believing that he has been removed from his sphere of action on earth, to a more blissful

sphere in regions beyond the skies.

The intense grief and mourning of relatives and connexions, the gloom and dejection of friends and acquaintances attest his exalted civil virtues; and his whole pilgrimage decides his character as a Christian.

In all truth and sincerity, we may exclaim; —
This day — "a great man has fallen in Israel."
