I have only received one letter
from her and that was filled
with questions, she gave me
no news of herself.

Since I last saw you
I have made a lecturing
tour in some of the northern
counties in England and
finished with Scotland
I lectured in Greenock &
Edinburgh and gave the
first public lecture there
on Theosophy - as I am unknown
in that town I begged to have

a very small hall and one
for 80 persons was taken
but over 300 came & so a larger
building in the same house
was used and after the lecture
I was just pelted with questions
Annie went there a few weeks
after and filled a hall with
400 - and now I hear that
many attend the meetings
and are interested.

I rejoice indeed to hear
that clergy men are taking
up Theosophy in Holland
Both Annie & W. L. speak
in high praise of your work
in Holland and gave much
all feel highly gratified
that all your devotees
and unwearied zeal are
bringing forth such good
fruit. In Sweden where so
little is done there seems to be
a general stagnation but
