Dear Sir

I am much obliged by your letter. Binney desires me to write to you and to Mr Levy to send instant information of Galbraith's committing any waste, & on affidavit he will send up an attachment. Mr requests Mr Levy would for all our sakes attend to this & send up to have Galbraith watched.

The cause is removed (for the sole purpose of delay) to Washington where Mr John Sijcant will attend to it for me.

Can any evidence be procured of Galbraith's bargain with Geary or of his holding as tenant under Geary? The mere presumption from Geary's purchasing at Sheriff's sale, is not sufficient.

Do me the kindness to consult with Mr Levy about this; & tell him to forward me instant information that we may get Galbraith off the Land. He has left his tavern keeper Lebo unpaid.
