My dear Colonel:

A Mr Herbert, a citizen of this state, living in the county adjoining this, who supposes that he has a claim to some real estate in London, in the neighbourhood of Covent Garden, has just now been to me to request that I would write you a line in his behalf. I cannot refuse to do so, so far as to say that it seems to me he is a respectable citizen, though, until within a few days, he has been a stranger to me. He is writing to Col: Powell, who he says knows him well; and he supposes that Col: P. will call on you in relation to

his case. If he should, I have ventured to
say to Mr Herbert, that I doubted not your
disposition to offer any suggestions or advice
that might occur to you, as useful to him.
My intimation to this worthy citizen, admitting
him to be such, was, that he ought to go to
work by regularly employing counsel
or a solicitor in London, even for his
preliminary inquiries, without which he
could scarcely expect to make head-
way; but I cannot say what he means
to do.
