Dear Sir

I neglected to mention in our invitation this morn<sup>g</sup> that Mr. Ullman had intimated to Mr. Clark his intention to visit you before our court. In our invitation (except as to your colleague Mr. Russell) was confidential yet I take the liberty of asking you to be cautious not to say to Mr. Ullman that Mr. Clark would or should any design of making any arrangement in relation to the Phillips estate. I wish to you that morning that Mr. Ullman must be exceedingly free - any hint in such arrangement and that the offer of Mr. Clark would be of that character -
