Whealland, near Lancaster 17 September 1852.

My dear James /

Immediately on the receipt of your last letter, I wrote strongly to Dr. Carnahan in compliance with your request; but as yet have received no answer. Perhaps he may be waiting until you speak to him on the subject.

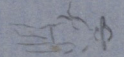
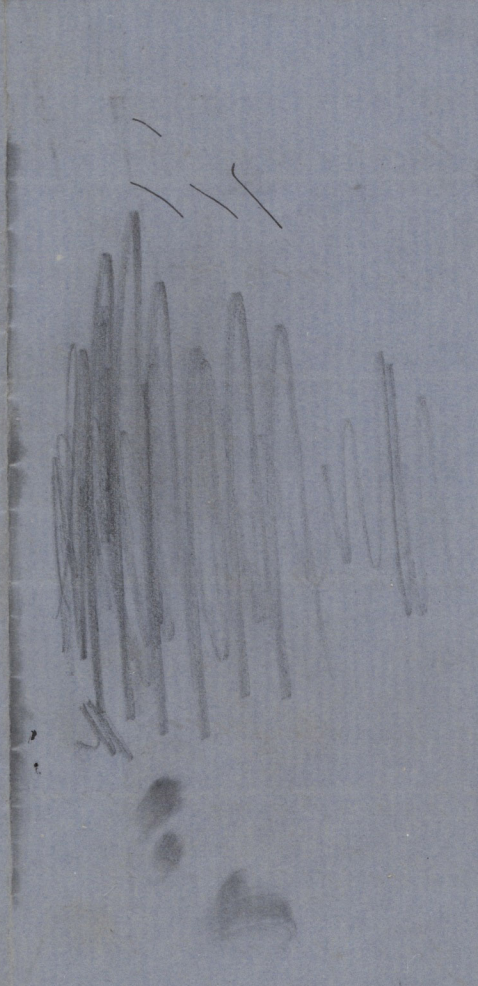
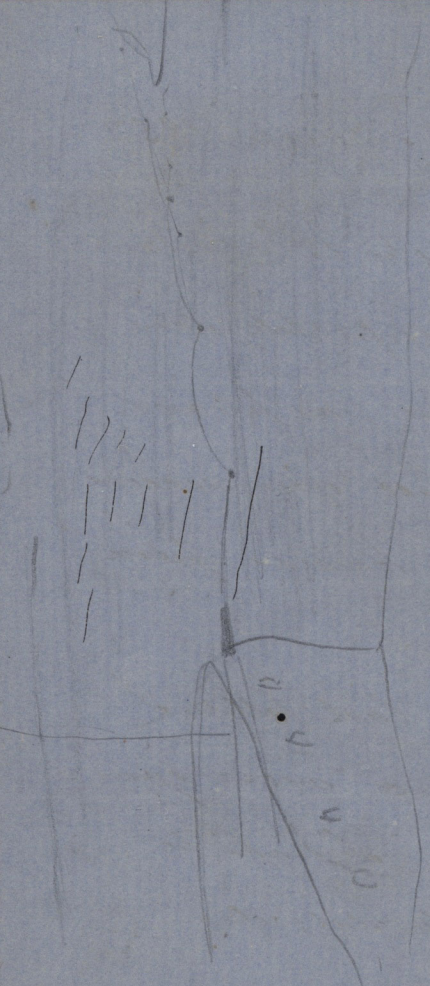
