transacting business which I have ever yet witnessed.

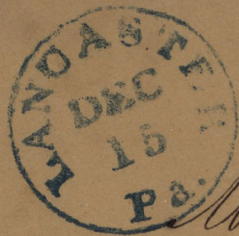
I enclose you \$10. -

It asks for the 'wherewithall' to return home, without stating any amount – the most singular mode of transacting business which I have ever yet witnessed. I enlose you \$10. Miss Clemens & Mrs. [Rose O'Neal] Greenhow [the Confederate spy] & Florence [her daughter] are yet here. They will most probably all leave before you return. Yours affectionately **James Buchanan***". The letter is written on white paper and is accompanied by the original envelope handwritten by Buchanan.
