signed in your House.

Having received no Answer from  
him, I request the Favor of You, Sir, to receive the Money  
& remit Me one hundred Dollars of it, by the first safe

Wilmington next Week — but, Col<sup>l</sup> Francis  
Johnson will be so good as to receive the Money &  
send it to Me — I am, Sir, your sincere Friend
