We are happy to find-that-health hear that health is again restored to you sometime in the course of the last summer I did myself the honor of sending you my thoughts on the important subject of Education I now send you my observations on Mr. Burke's reflections on the French revolution a work which has been much read in England both on account of the importance of the subject and the virulent manner in which the author has also-every-ebjection abused the French Legislaters and supported all these unjust distingtions and powere in society which have so long plagued oppressed and troubledmankind When you have read Mr. Burke yr Excellency will not be surprised that he has a large party in this country as it comprehends the Court the Dignified Clergy the Aristocratists and their dependants.
