WILL BE OPEN FOR VISITORS ON THE 10th DAY OF JUNE.

This beautiful Watering Place is situated on a branch of the Conodoguinet, five miles Northeast of Carlisle, in the County of Cumberland, Penna., and in full view of the Picturesque Scenery of the Blue Mountain, half a mile distant. The Medicinal properties of their waters resemble those of the "White Sulphur Springs," of Virginia. Both COLD AND WARM SULPHUR WATER BATHS are provided.

Among the enjoyments at Carlisle Springs, are a dry and healthful atmosphere, beautiful scenery, fine drives, pleasant walks, and a good table; also, Music, a Bowling Saloon, and the usual amusements of Watering Places. There is a Postoffice at the Springs, and a daily Mail, from the East, South, and West.

Visitors leaving Philadelphia or Baltimore in the morning train of Cars, will arrive at Carlisle, by way of Harrisburg and the Cumberland Valley Railroad, about two o'clock, P. M., from thence by hacks, a distance of five miles to the Springs, arriving before tea.

There will be kept on the premises A STOCK OF GOOD LIVERY HORSES AND CARRIAGES, for the accommodation of Visitors. No expense has been spared in securing good assistants, and it will be the aim of the Proprietors to add to the good reputation which this Establishment now enjoys.
