Old Point June 15. 1849

My Dear Sir

I received your letter this morning & send you the notes signed & indorsed. I do not know whether I have funds in the Bank to pay the dividend - If I have not, it shall be attended to as soon as I return. We have both of us reason to feel much obliged to Mr. Gittings in this business - for we are hardly ever in time, & my own negligence upon this subject is really excusable. But age and its infirmities have all come upon me & a growing infirmity for business is I find one of them.

Mr. Toney has improved here wonderfully in spite of the bad weather - and so has Eliza. As to myself - some days I feel as if I was better - but it lasts only for a day or so, and I cannot say that there is any improvement upon which I can look as an advance to restored health. - At my time of life & with so many infirmities about me I ought not perhaps to expect it.

I do not know yet on what day we shall
leave him. I leave it entirely to Anne, and
say nothing to her about it. She has en-
joyed it so much & is so evidently better that
I shall cheerfully continue until she
herself proposes to return. To day offers
some hope of a summer weather, which
will make it still more pleasant than
there is has been.

I rejoice to find that Baltimore has so
far escaped the cholera. Yet I think it would
be well for you to get into the country as soon
as you could. We must now have a
very warm weather & even in the absence
of the cholera the country will be desirable
for you all. - I am glad we shall be so near
to you - and although my walking days
are over, I yet hope that I shall sometimes
muster strength to walk over to your
cottage most affectionately
my love to all of you
