Dear Sir,

I have just received your kind letter of the 30th ultimo, inclosing, for my perusal, the letter of President Tyler to Gov. Branch. ~~for my perusal.~~
I thank you kindly, and have read this letter with much pleasure. I have confidence that Mr. Tyler will endeavour to carry out his Republican and State right principles; he has an arduous task, and it will require all his firmness to do this. It beholds him to meet those the arrogant pretensions of great Britain at the threshold, and meet her with a firm front on the Creole case, assuring her that indemnity must be promptly made, and the murderers restored for trial to the United States. That our national rights we are determined to protect and maintain at all hazards - our motto, we ask nothing but what is sheerly right, and permit nothing that is wrong.

I return you Mr. Tyler's letter and when you write to Governor Branch please convey to him a family my kind salutations & believe me to be very respectfully, yr Mo, ob^d servant
