Philadelphia April 1st 1842

My dear Sir -

I was unable to write you by
last night's mail, (owing to my not being able
to see Judge Randall yesterday) - He was in bed,
when I called at his house, and I had to write him
a note, the answer to which I inclose - As matters
will be appointed, and then will be no other Com-
-missions for your County) -

Pease

I should like very much to go up to Lancaster
to see Mr Buchanan, but I am so much engaged
here at this time, that I cannot leave - I should
like to have a talk with him not only about
Mr Tyson, but about many other matters -
Mr him I have always entertained the highest
respect & have had for years my eye steadily

fixed upon him as the Master Spirit who was to
redeem the reputation of Pennsylvania, and vindicate
his character and in his Elevation to the
Presidency to have his claims removed - and
altho' from an ignorance of the intentions of the
Democracy of the State to pass him for that post
at the approaching Presidential election, I was
induced last summer to lend my countenance
to the pretensions of another distinguished Pen-
-sylvania, their claims of one or two can
no longer be considered as conflicting) - With
their views & feelings, I did not hesitate to ask
from him justice to a personal friend - Did I
claim too much? I can only add what I have
before stated to you that in no way could he obligate
me more than by his advocacy of Dr Syms Confir-
-mation

I am exceedingly indebted to you for the very
kind manner, in which you have acted in this
matter & am assured that I shall always hold it
in grateful remembrance. I am very but respects
to Mr Matthews.
