To Mrs. Taney.

I begin my vacation by telling you that I am much better - have no fever and scarcely any cough - and my little hoarseness - and hope to be well enough to be in court on Monday.

I was quite surprised when the girls walked into my room and had not the least expectation of seeing them & hoped that my letter would not make you uneasy about me. Yet it was a most agreeable surprise - and it was a pleasure indeed to feel that I had any of my family about me. Maria told you in her letter of yesterday that unfortunately we had no room in this house - and that they are staying with the Shaaffs. They were here today with Anne - Mary being a little unwell and unable to come with them. They returned to dinner. Alice was about to write to you from my room - but they had to call s before they returned, and I thought her letter would detain them too long - and told her I would make her excuses to you and write myself. She says she will write to you tonight and bring her letter with her tomorrow. They saw Howard, who told them she heard you were still doing well. I hope it is so - and trust that you will soon feel that your health is returning. Tell Ellen and Sophia they must remember how anxious I am about those at home, although I have some with me.
