Montgomery County, to wit

Frederick and Ezekiah Linthicum late of Montgomery County, Yeomen, executors of the last will and testament of Zachariah Linthicum, late of said County deceased, was summoned to answer unto Thomas P. Willson in a plea, that they ^{under} unto the said Thomas, the sum of three hundred and twenty seven pounds, three Shillings and eight pence, current money which they unjustly detain from him and so forth.

And whereupon the said Thomas, by H. B. Yancy, his attorney, saith that whereas the said Zachariah Linthicum, on the fifth day of November in the year, eighteen hundred and six ~~hundred~~ at the County aforesaid, by his written Bill obligatory, promised to pay or cause to be paid unto Thomas Pevy Willson aforesaid his heirs or assigns, the sum of three hundred and twenty seven pounds, three Shillings and eight pence, current money of Maryland, with legal interest thereon from the eighth day of August last for value received. Nevertheless the said Zachariah, in his lifetime, and the said Frederick and Ezekiah, since the death of the Zachariah (although often therunto required) the said sum of money or any part thereof to him the said Thomas P. Willson have not nor hath

either of them, rendered or paid, but the same sum
of money or any part thereof, to him the said Thomas
to render or pay, the said Zachariah, in his life-
time and the said Goodwick and Ezekeiah, since
the death of the said Zachariah, have and each of
them hath, altogether refused and the said Good-
wick and Ezekeiah still doth refuse, whereupon
the said Thomas saith he is the worse and hath
damage to the value ^{of} fifty pounds, pursuant
thereto and therefore he brings suit and so
forth and brings here into Court the Bill
obligatory aforesaid, sealed with the seal of the
said Zachariah, in his life time, which witnesseth
the debt aforesaid, in form aforesaid, the date whereof
is the day and year in that behalf above mentioned
and so forth.
