Montgomery County, to wit

William W. King and Charles Miles late of Montgomery County, yeomen, were summoned to answer unto Alexander Warfield executor of John W. Warfield in a plea that they render unto him the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, Lawrent money which from him they unjustly detain and so forth.

And whereupon the said Alexander by A. B. Ganey, his attorney, saith that whereas the said William and Charles, on the fourteenth day of January, in the year, eighteen hundred and eleven, at the County aforesaid, by their certain Bill obligatory, twelve months after Date promised to pay or cause to be paid unto him the said John W. Warfield, ^{in his lifetime} his heirs or assigns the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, Lawrent money of Maryland, with legal interest thereon from Date for value received.

Nevertheless the aforesaid William and Charles the said sum of one hundred and fifty pounds Lawrent money, to him the said John in his lifetime or to the said Alexander since the death of the said John (although often therunto required) have not yet paid, but the same sum of money to him the said John in his lifetime, or to the said Alexander, since the

Death of the said John, to render or pay have
 hitherto refused and the same or any part
 thereof, to him the said Alexander to render
 or pay, still do refuse and unjustly detain
 wherefore the said Alexander saith he is the
 worse and hath Damage to the value of
 fifty pounds, Current Money, and therefore
 he brings suit and so forth and the said
 Alexander brings here into Court as will
 the Bill obligatory aforesaid, sealed with the
 seals of the said William and Charles, the
 date whereof is the day and year in that behalf
 mentioned, which sufficiently testifies the
 Debt aforesaid, in form aforesaid, as the letter of
 testamentary of the said John, whereby it suf-
 ficiently appears to the Court here, that the said
 Alexander is executor of the testament and last
 will of the said John and hath execution thereof and
 so forth.
