Your appeal from the decision of the Levy Court relative to the road, will be for trial at February Term - It will be decided by the court and not by a Jury - whether it will be tried on the evidence offered in the Levy Court & which will be sent up with the appeal to the County Court - or whether new evidence will be admitted. I cannot undertake to say positively. My opinion is that it ought to be tried on the record sent up from the Levy Court, & no other evidence admitted - But the point is a new one this being the first case of the kind, since the passage of the act of assembly giving jurisdiction in such cases to the Levy court - It will therefore be adviseable to be prepared with any testimony, you may deem imaterial,, if the court should decide to admit new evidence - The only evidence material for you to produce, would be such as will go to shew the extent of the injury you will sustain by the road claimed by manse, or that a road in a different location might be laid out without doing so much injury to you -
