Philadelphia June 15th 1864

Dear Daughter

I send you enclosed - a foreign letter
which came yesterday

I left here for Williamsport on the 11th of ~~June~~ ^{May}
as weather continued raining & water high
I did not go up Logansport till 24th of May
into Patton & Mr Knox of Pittsburg - Leiby &
Charles Smith & DeLeidy met us at Snells
I returned to Williamsport with ~~DeLeidy~~
on 4th of June - as every one there was coming down
to the fair, I returned home on the 7th of June
But as court begins at Williamsport next Monday
I will return this week - after court is over
I expect to return by McKeesbarre to see Dele-
& the children - I suppose Mary & your Ma
will inform you of these schemes for the summer
I am not fully informed of them - but I suppose I
will have to conform to them

The fair absorbs all attention, many acts & gypsies
fortune tellers & ruses some funds thereby
The president is expected tomorrow - and will
add to the caravan of rare animals on exhibi-
-tion.

What is your plan for the summer?
have you been trying the water cure, quackery
I fear it will do you more harm than good
I am congratulated every where as looking
in better health than I have done in three
years past - but am still wake in limbs -
would like to hear from you - a letter would
reach me at Nalhamspit up to 26th June
afterwards here -

Mary acts gypse fortune teller & raises some funds thereby The president is expected tomorrow-- and will add to the caravan of rare animals on exhibition.

What is your plan for the summer? have you been trying the water cure, quackery I fear it will do you more harm than good I am congratulated every where as looking in better health than I have done in three years past--but am still weak in limbs-- Would like to hear from you--a letter would reach me at Williamsport up to 26th June afterwards here--
