Wheatland 18 June 1849.

My dear James

After the receipt of your letter of the 9<sup>th</sup> Instant, I wrote to Mr. Bolmar (11<sup>th</sup>) & after expressing regret that you had lost any time in consequence of sickness I proceeded to say: - "It is my particular desire that James should enter the Sophomore Class at Princeton in the Fall. With this view I procured for him a statement of the Classical Studies required for this purpose which, I hope, he has presented to you. If not, I would thank you to ask him for it & direct his studies accordingly." I hope this may have been done.

I expect to leave here tomorrow for Washington City & may be absent for a week or ten days. Please mention this to Mr. Bolmar, as I should be sorry he would visit Lancaster during my absence.
