Sunday July 26. 1791

With this you will receive two
copies of my Paper for the Philosophical Transactions,
one for yourself, and the other for Mr Morely. I
fear I shall not soon be able to furnish ma-
terial for another. Indeed, what I shall do, or
when I shall settle, is uncertain. I shall how-
ever, continue at Birmingham if possible, and
resume all my pursuits, in which case I must
trouble you for a fresh stock of retorts, tubes
&c &c. This ~~A~~ invasion of the Goths and
Vandals I little foresaw, and hope^d will never
be repeated, as I ~~trust~~^{fancy} the experiment will not
be found to answer.
