## HOWARD GARTNER

is a young American Baritone of already brilliant and important attainments. Several years of assiduous work with the well-known vocal instructor, coach and pianist, MR. ALLEN TANNER of New York, Paris, and Chicago, have equipped him with a masterly technique, superb musicianship and an unusually expressive, varied style.

MR. GARTNER made his Debut on September Fifth, 1937, with the Women's Symphony, in Lincoln Park, Mr. George Dasch conducting.
