OPERA SINGER DIFS AFTER OPFRATIONS

Alice Miriam, Lyric Soprano, and "Baby of Metropolitan," Expires in Hospital.

Alice Miriam, dramatic soprano, known as "The Baby of the Metropolitan Opera," died Saturday evening at 10:30 o'clock in a private room of the Flower Hospital.

Mlle. Miriam, who was Alice Miriam Finch, of Glendale, Maryland, was operated on a week ago for appendicitis. She was apparently on her way to recovery when on Saturday morning septicaemia set in and necessitated another operation, from which she did not rally,

Mile. Miriam returned to Amer ica after study abroad eight years ago. She was chosen by Caruso to accompany him on one of his concert tours and was engaged later by the Metropolitan Opera. She completed a two-year contract last season and had signed a new contract for three years more.

Mile. Miriam was best known to opera patrons as the singer of the role of Micaela in "Carmen" on Farrar nights. She won special praise last season when she stepped into the role of Snegouretchka, the leading part of the "Snow Maiden." e of Mine Bort

threatened a postponement promiere. She took the part on an

hour's notice.
