FOR THE REVIEW OF SATURDAY'S FOOT BALL GAME
SEE THE REVERSE SIDE

THE SENATOR REVIEW OF THE CARLISLE DICKINSON--SWARTHMORE GAME

A couple of extra points and a safety proved the difference last Saturday as Swarthmore downed Dickinson 23-18, in the season opener for both teams. Before approximately 2,500 spectators at Swarthmore, the home team cashed in on two extra point attempts to none for the Red Devils in a see-saw offensive battle that could have gone either way.

Dickinson started the game in fine fashion. Jack Thomas, on the second play of the game, intercepted a Swarthmore pass on the enemy 33 yard line and raced up to the 20. With Reno DiOrio operating the team, the Devils scored in six plays with Thomas carrying the ball 7 yards off-tackle for the touchdown. Thomas tried off-tackle again for the two points but was stopped.

Swarthmore promptly marched 68 yards in 18 plays for the tying touchdown. Halfback John Green then put the home team ahead when he booted the extra point. The highlights of Swarthmore's march were two crucial fourth down plays with long yardage to go for a first down. A fake kick and run around left end for 16 yards pulled them out of a hole the first time, and a 13 yard double reverse was the answer the second time.

(Dickinson Scores Again): Dickinson bounced right back after the kick-off and went 59 yards in 9 plays for their second touchdown. DiOrio led this second period advance with runs of 10 and 11 yards. Bob Harlowe crashed into the end zone from 4 yards out with eleven minutes left in the second period for the score. Once again Dickinson tried for the two point conversion and again they failed as DiOrio's pass was incomplete. The Devils 12-7 advantage was short-lived, however, as the home team rolled 70 yards in 9 attempts for the touchdown. Three passes by their sophomore quarterback featured the drive. Bob Lillie threw for gains of 34, 18 and 8 yards through the leaky Dickinson pass defenses. Halfback Green increased Swarthmore's lead when he went over the right side of the Dickinson line for the two point conversion. Swarthmore now led 15-12.

(Fumble on the Goal Line): The Red Devils, with Walt Buckley at quarterback, proceeded to fashion a drive of their own after the kick-off. With time running out in the half, Buckley alternated Thomas and Dan Shaver off-tackle and tossed a 10 yard pass to Durb Wagner, which brought Dickinson to Swarthmore's 5 with only a minute and a half remaining. A penalty put the ball on Swarthmore's one with 0:53 left. Reno DiOrio, who had taken over at quarter for Buckley, tried a sneak. The officials placed the ball inches from the goal. On the following play DiOrio and center Barney Field missed connections on the center snap and Swarthmore took over on their goal line, as the half ended.

(21-12 Swarthmore): A quick-kick that failed set up Swarthmore's third score. With a third and eleven situation on their own 13, the Devils tried to punt out of danger. However, fullback Lou Verdelli let the ball slide off his foot, and it went only 9 yards. From the Dickinson 22, Swarthmore needed only six plays to score. Green missed the kick for the extra point but the home team still led 21-12.

(Buckley Unwinds): The remainder of the third period saw both teams advance little past midfield. Early in the final quarter, though, Buckley took over at quarter for Dickinson with the ball on the Swarthmore 41. On the first play Buckley threw 34 yards to sophomore Dan Shaver putting the ball on the enemy 7. Wasting no time, Buckley tossed a looping pass to Harry Packard in the right flat for the touchdown. The pass for the extra point missed for the third time.

(One Last Chance): With six minutes left Dickinson got a reprieve. Swarthmore punted to the Devils 40. However, Thomas and DiOrio were both spilled for losses and a Buckley pass failed, so the visitors were forced to punt. Swarthmore chewed up time with a march to the Dickinson 12 where they fumbled and Packard recovered for Dickinson. With a minute to go in the game the fired-up Swarthmore line mobbed Buckley in the end zone for a safety to make the final score read 23-18.

FOR THE REVIEW OF SATURDAY'S FOOTBALL GAME
SEE THE REVERSE SIDE

The Dickinson Red Devils squared their seasonal record at 1-1 Saturday with a decisive 26-6 victory over outmanned Haverford at Haverford. Only a late touchdown by the home team prevented Dickinson from recording their third straight shutout in as many seasons over the Fords.

Quarterback Reno DiOrio, with two touchdowns, and kicking specialist John Harper, with two field goals, spearheaded an attack that amassed 169 yards on the ground and 80 yards through the air.

(FIRST QUARTER) Dickinson scored the first time they got their hands on the ball. Jack Thomas returned the ball 33 yards to the D'son 45. DiOrio throw twice to Bob Harlowe. Harlowe made a brilliant one-handed grab on one of DiOrio's tosses to keep Dickinson's drive alive. From the Haverford 26, DiOrio rolled to the right, faked a pass and raced all the way into the end zone. John Harper missed at the conversion attempt and Dickinson led 6-0.

Late in the first quarter, quarterback Walt Buckley had the Devil on the march. However the home team tightened up and held on their own 34, and Red Devil coach Don Seibert sent in John Harper to try a field goal.

(SECOND QUARTER) Harper, on the first play of the second quarter, split the uprights with a towering 39 yard field goal. Dickinson now led 9-0.

Dan Shaver's twisting 17 yard punt return to the Haverford 43 put the Devils in position for their second touchdown. Shaver and Harlowe moved the ball to the opponent's 33, and DiOrio swept around left end from there, bounced off two tacklers and went all the way for his second touchdown. Harper converted, and Dickinson led 16-0.

With less than a minute left in the half, Buckley again moved the team within field goal distance. Harper came through for the second time with a 32 yarder and D'son led at the half 19-0.

(THIRD QUARTER) Another fine punt return by Shaver, this one 13 yards, set up Dickinson's third and final touchdown midway in the third period. With the football on the Haverford 30, Dickinson needed six plays to get into the end zone. Harlowe drove to the 25, and DiOrio ran to the 12. However, a fifteen yard penalty pushed the Devils back to the Haverford 27. From there Verdelli bulled to the 24 and DiOrio threw passes of 13 and 11 yards to end Joe Lipinski. The second pass, for 11 yards, found Lipinski wide open in the end zone. When Harper converted, Dickinson led 26-0.

(FOURTH QUARTER) Haverford got their first first down of the game early in the final quarter. With Dickinson's third unit in the game, the Fords drove 36 yards for their only touchdown of the game. Fullback Joe Schulze scored from six yards out with less than three minutes to go. The Home team failed on the conversion attempt and Dickinson wound up on the long end of the 26-6 score.

F. & M. NEXT SATURDAY

With their third straight one-sided victory over Haverford in three years, Dickinson now awaits the "big-game" against F. & M. on Saturday, Parent's Day. Although the Devils attack looked sharper against Swarthmore two Saturdays ago, they did uncover a weapon that may prove invaluable in the games ahead. This is John Harper who clicked for two long field goals, something that hasn't been done at Dickinson in at least three years. Harper represents a definite scoring threat from anyplace inside the opponents 40.

Another bright note was the team's pass defense which held Haverford's vaunted air-attack-2nd in the conference last year-to 15 yards.

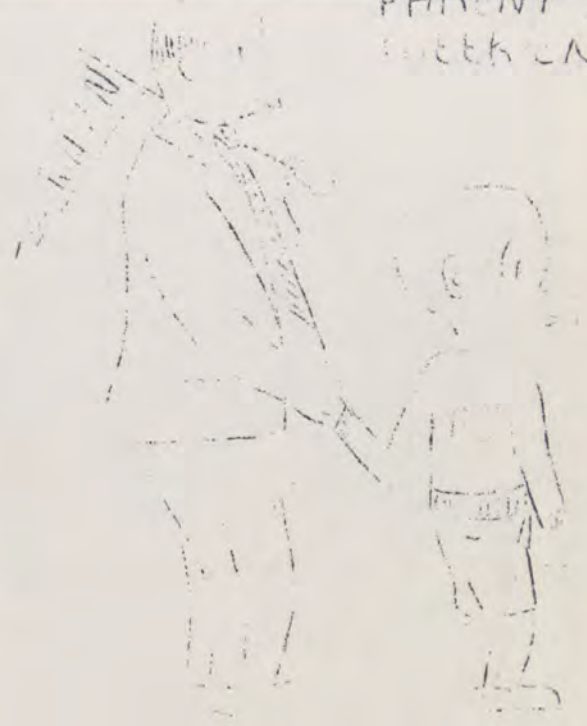

THE SENATOR REVIEW OF THE CARLISLE DICKINSON--F & M GAME

In a persistent rain, on as untidy a Parent's Day as could be imagined, Dickinson's 1961 football team pulled off one of the College's most memorable sporting triumphs when they crushed Franklin and Marshall Saturday 25-0. A stunning ground attack and a bruising defense were the magic potions that ended a "hex" which had stretched over 36 years.

Reno DiOrio, Dan Shaver, Jack Thomas and Dick Warden accounted for the Devil's Touchdowns as they did what no other Dickinson football team has been able to accomplish since 1925. The home team's brilliance in every aspect of the game left absolutely no doubt as to which team was superior on Saturday.

(FIRST QUARTER) The Devils started quickly, taking the opening kick-off and marching 76 yards for the score. After Thomas and Bob Harlowe had moved the ball to the 48, DiOrio faded to pass. Finding no receivers open he raced down to the F&M 31. Thomas went off-tackle for 10 more, and DiOrio bootlegged to the 15. Thomas, in two tries, carried to the 9 where DiOrio bootlegged around left end for the score. John Harper's kick was wide and the Devils led 6*0.

SHAVER GOES 80 YARDS-- After the kick-off F&M went up the middle for 12 yards and a first down. Two more tries up the middle netted them only three more yards. An end run was snuffed out by Joe Lipinski, and the Diplomats were forced to kick. Dan Shaver took the punt on his twenty and raced to the left sidelines where blocks by Sonny Shoff and Durb Wagner broke him free for the score. A holding penalty nullified Harper's kick and moved the ball to the 25, where he missed.

The Devils threatened again when Thomas caught an F&M fumble in mid-air and raced to the Dip's 43. With Shaver leading the way, they moved the ball down to the 17, where a holding penalty put the ball back to the 29. A DiOrio pass was just beyond Shaver's reach as F&M took over and the period ended.

(SECOND QUARTER) On the first play of the second quarter, Shoff recovered a fumble. Harlowe took the ball off-tackle for five yards, but holding moved it back to the 36. Thomas moved the ball to the 29. Harper then tried a field goal, which fell short to the left.

Later in the period the Devils took over on their own 14. Thomas and a penalty moved the ball to the 26. DiOrio turned right end for five yards and Thomas went off left guard for three more. DiOrio was just short of a first down on a 3rd down sneak. With fourth down and only inches to go DiOrio gambled on another sneak and got the first down. The drive stalled at mid-field, however, and D'son was forced to punt.

The center snap sailed over Verdelli's head, but he still managed to pick up the ball and kick. The low punt bounced off an F&M player and Shaver recovered on the F&M 46. The Devils took advantage of the break quickly, as DiOrio, running the option to perfection, pitched out to Thomas who went 43 yards for the score. DiOrio's pass for two points was knocked down, and the half soon ended with the Red Devils leading 18-0.

(SECOND-HALF) The third period saw F&M's only threat stall on the Dickinson 24. This was the closest the Dip's came to scoring all afternoon. In the fourth quarter, Walt Buckley directed the team to its final touchdown. Harry Packard recovered a fumble on the Dip's 25. Three plays later Buckley hit Dick Warden with a pass in the left flat, and Warden raced 20 yards for the TD. Harper's kick ended the scoring for the day at 25-0.

Football Review of the Dickinson College--Lebanon Valley game.

An injury-riddled Red Devil eleven played 21-point favorite Lebanon Valley to a virtual standstill Saturday, but a rask of fourth period penalties and the LV touchdown combined to hand D'son its third defeat of the season 16-7. In a highly controversial game, in which the victorious LV coach termed, "The worst officiated game I've ever seen", the Dutchmen stretched their unbeaten string to four. Tempers flared throughout the contest as D'son became the victims of 140 yards in penalties. D'son kicked off to LV to start the game, and John Harper booted the ball in the end-zone. The home team couldn't get rolling, and the Devils took over, after a punt, on their own 29. Two plays netted nothing and on third down, fullback Lou Verdelli quick-kicked 61 yards to the LV 21. A wobbly Dutchman punt, after three fruitless cracks at the visitors line, gave Dickinson possession at midfield. THOMAS SCORES: Reno DiOrio running the team from the "shotgun" formation, bulled through the center for 29 yards and again off tackle for four more. On the following play he turned right end for 15 yards to put the ball on the two. After a try up the middle himself, DiOrio, switching the team to the T-formation, handed to Thomas who sliced off left tackle into the end-zone. Harper converted and D'son led 7-0. LV SCORES ON PASS: In the second quarter the home team broke in the scoring column on a 70 yard march climaxed by a 13 yard pass for the touchdown. Their bid to run the extra point failed and the Devils still led 7-6.

D'son, going against the wind, failed to mount a threat following the kickoff, and LV began another drive from their own 30. With Halfback Fred Porrino leading the way, LV moved to Dickinson's 11 with a minute and a half to go in the half. With a first down on the 11, LV appeared ready to score again. However, jarring tackles by Morrissey and Shoff plus a diving deflection of a pass by Thomas stalled the Dutchmen's attack. From the 11, kicking specialist John Yajko booted home a field goal and LV led at the half 9-7.

OFFICIATING TURNS SOUR: The third quarter was a punting duel between MacMillan of LV and D'son's Bob Harlowe. The wind kept the Devils backed into their own territory almost the entire period. As the 4th quarter began Lebanon Valley was on the visitor's 14. With a fourth down situation the Dutchmen faked a field goal, but MacMillan, trying to pass was smothered behind the line and D'son took over. A 15 yard penalty, the first of many in the fourth quarter, put Dickinson on its own six. Harlowe, with 13:00 left in the game, punted magnificently to the LV 22, a distance of 71 yards! With plenty of time left on the clock for Dickinson to score, the officiating turned sour. Three crippling 15 yard penalties for roughness and a couple of line bucks by Porrino took the ball to the D'son two. From there Halfback Terry Herr swept left end for the score. Yajko converted and LV led 16-7 with 4:57 left in the game. Two more 15 yard penalties ruined any chance the Devils might have had at a comeback, and the final score read 16-7.

THE SENATOR REVIEW OF THE CARLISLE DICKINSON--WILKES FOOTBALL GAME

In the rain and mud of Artillery Field in Kingston, Saturday, the Dickinson Red Devils squared their seasonal record at 3-3 with a 7-6 victory over Wilkes College. A quick 11 yard pass from quarterback Reno DiOrio to end Joe Lipinski accounted for Dickinson's touchdown, and John Harper's reliable toe provided the extra point as the Devil's broke a two season losing streak.

The 7-6 score fails to D'sons credit as they controlled play throughout the game and held a wide edge over the home team on paper: first downs D'son 11--Wilkes 6; rushing, D'son 159 yards--Wilkes 78. The Colonels never penetrated within Dickinson's 18 yard line, and their only score came when tackle Chuck Cherundolo ran 22 yards with a blocked punt.

(LIPINSKI SCORES): The first quarter witnessed an exchange of quick kicks on both sides as neither teams posed any serious threat. Midway through the second period, however, Dickinson got a break. With the ball on their own 37 and long yardage to go for a first down, Wilkes' peppery little quarterback Ted Travis-Bey threw deep down on the right sidelines. Jack Thomas intercepted for the Red Devils on the D'son 47 and raced back to the Wilkes 34. Two minutes later Dickinson had its touchdown. From the "shotgun" formation, DiOrio ripped off six yards to the 28, Dick Warden, who ran hard all afternoon, got three to the 25, and DiOrio slashed to the 20 for a first down. On first down DiOrio threw to Kip Howell and missed. Bob Harlowe then hit the line for five to the 15, and DiOrio set up a fourth-and-one situation when he drove to the 11. With the Wilkes linebackers playing tight for a run, DiOrio, calling the play from the line of scrimmage, flipped a pass to Lipinski on the left who bolted into the end zone. Harper made it 7-0 at the half with his placement conversion.

(BLOCKED PUNT): Wilkes broke into the scoring column late in the third period. When D'sons attack stalled on the Visitor's 30, Bob Harlowe dropped back to punt. The center snap to Harlowe was low and before he could get his boot away, Wilkes end Larry Turel came through to smother the ball. Grabbing the loose ball on the first bounce Cherundolo scampered untouched into the end zone. On the conversion try Wilkes' snap from center was wild, and Bill Smith followed by the right side of the Devil line "gang-tackled" place-kicker Frank Wallace as he tried to escape around left end.

(D'SON THREATENS): Some brilliant running by DiOrio, Thomas and Warden kept the home team within the shadow of its own goal throughout the fourth quarter. Dickinson made one major bid to score midway through the period. A couple of runs by Thomas and DiOrio put the Red Devils on the Wilkes one on fourth down, but a backfield fumble ruined D'son's touchdown hopes.

THE SENATOR REVIEW OF THE CARLISLE DICKINSON--JOHNS HOPKINS GAME

All the hearts of the Dickinson alumni were warmed on a cold Saturday afternoon after the Homecoming victory. Dickinson scored a decisive 20-8 victory over Johns Hopkins to boost the season record to 4-3. The Red Devils, on their way to three touchdowns and two extra points, amassed 244 yards. The most spectacular play was a 55 yard touchdown from Walt Buckley to Jack Thomas.

FIRST QUARTER) The ball exchanged hands five times during the first quarter and the only sustained drive was made by Johns Hopkins. The Jays took possession on their own 33 and marched to the Dickinson 7, where the aggressive forward wall of Dickinson successfully stopped the threat. Dickinson's offense was ineffective the first quarter and they averaged only 1.8 yards a carry and didn't even get into Johns Hopkins territory. A major factor in the scoreless quarter was the good defenses and kicking of both teams.

SECOND QUARTER) The Jays took possession on Dickinson's 49 after two plays in the quarter. Again the Jay's mounted an attack which carried them deep into Red Devil soil. The drive stalled when Dave Morrissey recovered a fumble on the Dickinson 14. Dickinson gained it's first 1st down of the day, but the drive halted on their own 47. After an exchange of kicks, Walt Buckley took over the quarterbacking chores on the Johns Hopkins 40. Buckley completed 3 out of 5 passes for 39 yards. With one minute to go in the half DiOrio carried over from the 1 foot line for the touchdown and Harper made it 7 points with his conversion. The Red Devils almost made a second touchdown on an intercepted pass by Smith. Seconds later the Jay's intercepted a Buckley pass on their own 5 yard line and the half ended.

THIRD QUARTER) A roughing the kicker penalty against Dickinson set the stage for the Jay's first and only touchdown. The Jay's march had started on their own 26. Sutley carried 1 yard for the touchdown and a fake placement and pass from Ciccarone to Kim netted two extra points and put Johns Hopkins ahead 8-7.

FOURTH QUARTER) A penalty against Johns Hopkins for a personal foul and a poor quick kick by Ciccarone gave Dickinson the ball on the Jay's 26. A loss of yardage brought the ball back to the 47 where John Harper came in to try a field goal. Harper's towering boot was far enough, but off to the left. With eight minutes remaining, D'son took the ball from their own 46 for a 55 yard touchdown pass from Walt Buckley to Jack Thomas. Buckley's tremendous 40 yard pass fell right in the arms of Thomas who simply scampered into the end zone. This was one of the most perfectly executed plays of the season and came at the right time, for now after Harper's wide placement, the Red Devils led 13-8. Dickinson gained possession on the Jay's 31 yard line after Dan Shaver returned a punt 23 yards. After nine plays, Harlowe closed the scoring with a three yard plunge. When Harper converted, the Red Devils enjoyed a 20-8 edge with only four minutes remaining.

THE SENATOR REVIEW OF THE DICKINSON COLLEGE--DREXEL FOOTBALL GAME

Reno DiOrio, three touchdowns, and Bob Harlowe, one touchdown, combined to lead the Dickinson Red Devils to a brilliant 27-8 victory over Drexel Saturday at Biddle Field. Scoring once in every quarter and piling up 240 yards on the ground, the Devils finished the 1961 season with a 5-3 record, the best since 1949 when D'ison was 5-2-1. At the final whistle Saturday, triumphant coach Don Seibert, a man whocame in for a good deal of unnecessary derision during the past three years, was carried across the field by a joyful D'ison team.

FIRST QUARTER) The last game of a highly successful season and the end of four-years of play for six outstanding seniors couldn't have happened in a more decisive or satisfying fashion. The Devils took a 6-0 lead with 12 minutes gone in the opening period. Dan Shaver caught a Drexel punt on his own 45, broke to his right, cut back to the left and threaded his way down the sidelines to the visitor's 15. After two running plays had moved the ball to the 7, DiOrio scored his first touchdown on a sweep of right end. Harper missed the conversion.

(CONTINUED ON REVERSE SIDE)

(DiOrio Sneaks In)--On the first play after the ensuing kickoff, Sonny Shoff recovered a fumble by Drexel's Ed Pekals on the visitor's 31. A Walt Buckley-to-Harry Packard pass moved D'son to the 21 and then, on the last play of the first quarter, Harlowe drove down to the 7. Taking over for Buckley at quarterback, DiOrio ran to the one on the second play of the second period. After missing once, DiOrio sneaked into the end zone for the touchdown on fourth down. Harper converted and D'son led 13-0.

Following the kickoff, Drexel drove 55 yards to score as Joe Buffalo went over from 4 yards out. The pass into the right corner of the end zone was good for the 2-point conversion, and Drexel trailed only 13-8.

(Harlowe Scores)--Play seesawed in the third quarter with Dickinson protecting its five-point lead. Finally with just over a minute to play in the third period, the Red Devils exploded. Taking a tip from injured co-captain Barney Field, (who watched the action from high in the stands), DiOrio began to attack the middle of the Drexel line with astonishing results. With the ball on the Dickinson 31, Harlowe ripped off 19 yards to midfield. Jack Thomas went through the right side for 14 more to the Drexel 36, and Harlowe cracked into the right side, spun twice and raced 36 yards for the touchdown. Harper added the point-after, and D'son led 20-8.

(DiOrio Goes 58 Yards)--With close to six minutes left in the game, Dickinson completed its scoring for the season on a spectacular note. Quarterback DiOrio, who gained 100 yards on 14 carries for the afternoon, put the finishing touches on a great year when he rolled around right end from the D'son 42, cut back and raced 58 yards to score on a run that left five Drexel tacklers in his wake. Harper made it three out of four conversions when he split the uprights to make the final score read 27-8.

(7 Seniors Bow Out)--Seven seniors ended their varsity careers Saturday. Bob Harlowe played a better game than he had played last week against John Hopkins when he won the MVP trophy as he gained 97 yards on 9 carries and a touchdown. Jack Thomas made important yardage all afternoon to wind up the year second to DiOrio in team rushing. Co-Captain Durb Wagner was brilliant on defense as he made tackles all over the field from his linebacking position. Dave Morrissey was solid in the line both on offense and defense, and he also caught a pass in the final two minutes on a tackle-eligible play. End Joe Lipinski wound up as the team's leading pass-catcher as he grabbed two on Saturday. Lipinski was particularly outstanding on defense, however, as he stopped Drexel on one series almost single-handedly. Kip Howell played a sound game both ways.

Perhaps the biggest disappointment Saturday belonged to Co-captain Barney Field who closed his career in the stands with a back injury. Field, whose tremendous value to the team couldn't be measured in yards or tackles, nevertheless played an important part in the victory. Watching from the stands, Field spotted a weakness in the Drexel defense that led to Dickinson's third and most decisive touchdown.
